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CHICAGO CITATION EXAMPLES FOR PUBLICATION DATE ARE A CORNERSTONE OF ACADEMIC INTEGRITY AND CLEAR SCHOLARLY COMMUNICATION, PARTICULARLY WITHIN THE HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES. ADHERING TO THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE (CMOS) ENSURES THAT YOUR SOURCES ARE CORRECTLY ATTRIBUTED, ALLOWING READERS TO EASILY LOCATE THE ORIGINAL MATERIAL AND UNDERSTAND THE CONTEXT OF YOUR RESEARCH. THIS GUIDE DELVES INTO THE INTRICACIES OF CITING PUBLICATION DATES ACROSS VARIOUS SOURCE TYPES, FROM BOOKS AND JOURNAL ARTICLES TO ONLINE RESOURCES AND EVEN LESS COMMON FORMATS. MASTERING THESE NUANCES IS CRUCIAL FOR AVOIDING PLAGIARISM AND BUILDING A ROBUST BIBLIOGRAPHY THAT SUPPORTS YOUR ARGUMENTS EFFECTIVELY. WE WILL EXPLORE THE STANDARD FORMATS, SPECIFIC VARIATIONS, AND COMMON CHALLENGES ENCOUNTERED WHEN REFERENCING THE DATES OF PUBLICATION IN CHICAGO STYLE.

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THE PUBLICATION DATE IS A FUNDAMENTAL PIECE OF BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION IN CHICAGO STYLE, SERVING MULTIPLE CRITICAL FUNCTIONS. PRIMARILY, IT ESTABLISHES THE HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF THE INFORMATION PRESENTED, ALLOWING READERS TO ASSESS THE CURRENCY AND RELEVANCE OF YOUR SOURCES. KNOWING WHEN A WORK WAS PUBLISHED HELPS IN UNDERSTANDING THE INTELLECTUAL CLIMATE AND PREVAILING IDEAS AT THE TIME OF ITS CREATION, WHICH IS ESPECIALLY IMPORTANT IN FIELDS LIKE HISTORY, LITERATURE, AND PHILOSOPHY.

FURTHERMORE, ACCURATE PUBLICATION DATES ARE ESSENTIAL FOR READERS WHO WISH TO FIND THE SOURCE THEMSELVES. A CORRECT DATE, WHEN COMBINED WITH OTHER BIBLIOGRAPHIC DETAILS SUCH AS AUTHOR, TITLE, AND PUBLISHER, FORMS A UNIQUE IDENTIFIER THAT SIGNIFICANTLY AIDS IN LOCATING THE SPECIFIC EDITION OR VERSION OF A WORK. THIS PRECISION IS FUNDAMENTAL TO THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE'S EMPHASIS ON METICULOUS SOURCING AND ACADEMIC RIGOR.

IN ESSENCE, THE PUBLICATION DATE ACTS AS A TEMPORAL ANCHOR FOR YOUR RESEARCH. IT HELPS TO DISTINGUISH BETWEEN DIFFERENT EDITIONS OF THE SAME WORK, WHICH CAN HAVE SIGNIFICANT VARIATIONS IN CONTENT, PREFACE, OR EDITORIAL NOTES. FOR RESEARCHERS, THIS TEMPORAL CLARITY PREVENTS MISATTRIBUTION AND ENSURES THAT THE INFORMATION CITED ACCURATELY REFLECTS THE SOURCE CONSULTED.

CITING BOOKS WITH PUBLICATION DATES

CITING BOOKS IN CHICAGO STYLE INVOLVES PRESENTING THE PUBLICATION DATE IN A STANDARDIZED FORMAT, TYPICALLY AT THE END OF THE CITATION, AFTER THE PUBLISHER'S NAME. THIS PLACEMENT IS CONSISTENT ACROSS BOTH FOOTNOTES/ENDNOTES AND THE BIBLIOGRAPHY, THOUGH THE PUNCTUATION MAY DIFFER SLIGHTLY. THE MOST COMMON FORMAT FOR A BOOK CITATION IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY IS:

BIBLIOGRAPHY FORMAT FOR BOOKS

THE STANDARD FORMAT FOR A BOOK IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY INCLUDES THE AUTHOR'S NAME, THE FULL TITLE OF THE BOOK (ITALICIZED), PUBLICATION INFORMATION, AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. THE PUBLISHER AND CITY OF PUBLICATION ARE GENERALLY INCLUDED BEFORE THE YEAR.

- AUTHOR LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. *BOOK TITLE*. CITY OF PUBLICATION: PUBLISHER, YEAR.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- SMITH, JOHN. *THE HISTORY OF CHICAGO*. CHICAGO: UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO PRESS, 2020.

FOOTNOTE/ENDNOTE FORMAT FOR BOOKS

FOOTNOTES AND ENDNOTES OFFER A SLIGHTLY MORE CONDENSED FORMAT, OFTEN OMITTING THE CITY OF PUBLICATION BUT RETAINING THE PUBLISHER AND YEAR. THE AUTHOR'S NAME IS PRESENTED IN FIRST NAME, LAST NAME ORDER.

- FIRST NAME LAST NAME, *BOOK TITLE* (CITY OF PUBLICATION: PUBLISHER, YEAR), PAGE NUMBER.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- JOHN SMITH, *THE HISTORY OF CHICAGO* (CHICAGO: UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO PRESS, 2020), 45.

MULTIPLE EDITIONS AND REVISED WORKS

WHEN CITING A LATER EDITION OR A REVISED VERSION OF A BOOK, IT IS CRUCIAL TO INDICATE THIS. THE ORIGINAL PUBLICATION YEAR IS OFTEN NOTED, FOLLOWED BY THE YEAR OF THE EDITION YOU ARE CONSULTING.

- AUTHOR LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. *BOOK TITLE*. REVISED ED. CITY OF PUBLICATION: PUBLISHER, YEAR. (ORIGINAL PUBLICATION YEAR IF RELEVANT)

FOR EXAMPLE:

- ADAMS, JANE. *URBAN PLANNING PRINCIPLES*. 3RD ED. NEW YORK: ROUTLEDGE, 2018. (FIRST PUBLISHED 2010)

CITING JOURNAL ARTICLES WITH PUBLICATION DATES

JOURNAL ARTICLES ARE TYPICALLY CITED WITH THEIR PUBLICATION YEAR PROMINENTLY FEATURED. THE EXACT PLACEMENT CAN DEPEND ON WHETHER YOU ARE USING THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM OR THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM. FOR MOST HUMANITIES DISCIPLINES THAT USE CHICAGO STYLE, THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM IS COMMON, WHERE THE YEAR APPEARS AT THE END OF THE CITATION.

BIBLIOGRAPHY FORMAT FOR JOURNAL ARTICLES

THE BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRY FOR A JOURNAL ARTICLE INCLUDES THE AUTHOR, ARTICLE TITLE, JOURNAL TITLE (ITALICIZED), VOLUME AND ISSUE NUMBERS, AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. THE PAGE RANGE OF THE ARTICLE IS ALSO INCLUDED.

- AUTHOR LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. "ARTICLE TITLE." *JOURNAL TITLE* VOLUME, no. ISSUE (YEAR): PAGE RANGE.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- MILLER, SARAH. "THE EVOLUTION OF URBAN PARKS." *JOURNAL OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES* 45, no. 2 (2019): 112-130.

FOOTNOTE/ENDNOTE FORMAT FOR JOURNAL ARTICLES

SIMILAR TO BOOKS, THE FOOTNOTE OR ENDNOTE FORMAT IS SLIGHTLY MORE CONDENSED AND BEGINS WITH THE AUTHOR'S NAME IN FIRST NAME, LAST NAME ORDER. THE YEAR IS TYPICALLY PLACED AT THE END, FOLLOWING THE PAGE RANGE.

- FIRST NAME LAST NAME, "ARTICLE TITLE," *JOURNAL TITLE* VOLUME, no. ISSUE (YEAR): PAGE NUMBER.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- SARAH MILLER, "THE EVOLUTION OF URBAN PARKS," *JOURNAL OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES* 45, no. 2 (2019): 115.

ARTICLES WITH DOI

WHEN A DIGITAL OBJECT IDENTIFIER (DOI) IS AVAILABLE, IT IS OFTEN INCLUDED IN JOURNAL ARTICLE CITATIONS. THE PUBLICATION DATE REMAINS A KEY ELEMENT.

- AUTHOR LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. "ARTICLE TITLE." *JOURNAL TITLE* VOLUME, no. ISSUE (YEAR): PAGE RANGE. doi:XX.XXXX/XXXXXXXXX.

CITING MAGAZINE AND NEWSPAPER ARTICLES WITH PUBLICATION DATES

MAGAZINES AND NEWSPAPERS HAVE DIFFERENT PUBLICATION SCHEDULES, AND THEIR CITATION FORMATS REFLECT THIS. THE PUBLICATION DATE IS CRUCIAL FOR PINPOINTING THE SPECIFIC ISSUE FROM WHICH THE INFORMATION IS DRAWN.

BIBLIOGRAPHY FORMAT FOR MAGAZINE ARTICLES

MAGAZINE CITATIONS INCLUDE THE AUTHOR, ARTICLE TITLE, MAGAZINE TITLE (ITALICIZED), ISSUE DATE (MONTH AND DAY), AND PAGE NUMBER(S).

- AUTHOR LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. "ARTICLE TITLE." *MAGAZINE TITLE*, MONTH DAY, YEAR. PAGE NUMBER(S).

FOR EXAMPLE:

- DAVIS, ROBERT. "THE FUTURE OF PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION." *CITY LIVING MAGAZINE*, JULY 15, 2021. 32-35.

BIBLIOGRAPHY FORMAT FOR NEWSPAPER ARTICLES

NEWSPAPER CITATIONS SIMILARLY REQUIRE THE FULL DATE OF PUBLICATION, INCLUDING MONTH AND DAY, TO SPECIFY THE EXACT EDITION.

- AUTHOR LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. "ARTICLE TITLE." *NEWSPAPER TITLE*, MONTH DAY, YEAR. PAGE NUMBER(S).

FOR EXAMPLE:

- CHEN, LI. "DEBATE OVER NEW ZONING LAWS INTENSIFIES." *CHICAGO TRIBUNE*, OCTOBER 26, 2022. A1.

FOOTNOTE/ENDNOTE FORMAT FOR MAGAZINE AND NEWSPAPER ARTICLES

THE FOOTNOTE/ENDNOTE FORMAT FOLLOWS THE SAME PRINCIPLES, WITH THE AUTHOR'S NAME IN THE FIRST NAME, LAST NAME ORDER AND A PAGE NUMBER INDICATING THE SPECIFIC LOCATION OF THE CITED MATERIAL.

- FIRST NAME LAST NAME, "ARTICLE TITLE," *MAGAZINE TITLE*, MONTH DAY, YEAR, PAGE NUMBER.
- FIRST NAME LAST NAME, "ARTICLE TITLE," *NEWSPAPER TITLE*, MONTH DAY, YEAR, PAGE NUMBER.

CITING ONLINE RESOURCES AND THEIR PUBLICATION DATES

CITING ONLINE RESOURCES PRESENTS UNIQUE CHALLENGES, AS PUBLICATION DATES MAY BE LESS STRAIGHTFORWARD OR EVEN ABSENT. WHEN AVAILABLE, THE PUBLICATION DATE IS ESSENTIAL FOR ESTABLISHING THE CURRENCY OF THE INFORMATION. CHICAGO STYLE RECOMMENDS INCLUDING THE DATE OF PUBLICATION OR LAST UPDATE IF IT IS CLEARLY INDICATED.

WEBSITES AND WEBPAGES

FOR WEBSITES AND INDIVIDUAL WEBPAGES, INCLUDE THE AUTHOR (IF KNOWN), TITLE OF THE PAGE, WEBSITE NAME, AND THE DATE OF PUBLICATION OR LAST UPDATE. A RETRIEVAL DATE IS ALSO OFTEN INCLUDED FOR DYNAMIC CONTENT THAT MIGHT CHANGE.

- AUTHOR LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. "TITLE OF WEBPAGE." WEBSITE NAME, MONTH DAY, YEAR. ACCESSED MONTH DAY, YEAR. URL.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- NATIONAL PARK SERVICE. "ABOUT LINCOLN PARK ZOO." LINCOLN PARK ZOO, MAY 10, 2023. ACCESSED NOVEMBER 15, 2023. [HTTPS://WWW.LPZOO.ORG/ABOUT-US](https://www.lpzoo.org/about-us).

ONLINE JOURNALS AND ARTICLES

WHEN CITING JOURNAL ARTICLES FOUND ONLINE, INCLUDE THE PUBLICATION DATE AS YOU WOULD FOR A PRINT JOURNAL, ALONG WITH THE DOI OR URL. IF THE ONLINE VERSION HAS A DIFFERENT PUBLICATION DATE THAN THE PRINT VERSION, PRIORITIZE THE ONLINE DATE.

- AUTHOR LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. "ARTICLE TITLE." *JOURNAL TITLE* VOLUME, no. ISSUE (YEAR): PAGE RANGE. DOI OR URL.

BLOG POSTS AND SOCIAL MEDIA

FOR BLOG POSTS, THE PUBLICATION DATE IS USUALLY EVIDENT. FOR SOCIAL MEDIA POSTS, INCLUDE THE DATE OF THE POST AND, IF APPLICABLE, A PLATFORM OR CONTEXT.

- AUTHOR LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. "TITLE OF BLOG POST." BLOG NAME, MONTH DAY, YEAR. URL.
- AUTHOR'S TWITTER HANDLE [ATUSERNAME]. "TWEET CONTENT." TWITTER, MONTH DAY, YEAR. URL.

HANDLING MISSING OR UNCERTAIN PUBLICATION DATES

IT IS NOT UNCOMMON TO ENCOUNTER SOURCES WHERE A PUBLICATION DATE IS NOT READILY AVAILABLE. CHICAGO STYLE PROVIDES SPECIFIC ABBREVIATIONS FOR THESE SITUATIONS TO MAINTAIN ACCURACY AND TRANSPARENCY.

UNKNOWN PUBLICATION DATE

WHEN A PUBLICATION DATE FOR A BOOK OR OTHER SOURCE CANNOT BE DETERMINED, USE THE ABBREVIATION "N.D." (NO DATE) IN PLACE OF THE YEAR.

- AUTHOR LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. *BOOK TITLE*. CITY OF PUBLICATION: PUBLISHER, N.D.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- WHITE, EMILY. *AN INTRODUCTION TO LOCAL HISTORY*. SPRINGFIELD: COMMUNITY PRESS, N.D.

UNCERTAIN PUBLICATION DATE

IF YOU HAVE AN ESTIMATE FOR THE PUBLICATION DATE BUT ARE NOT CERTAIN, YOU CAN USE THE ABBREVIATION "CA." (CIRCA) BEFORE THE YEAR. THIS INDICATES "AROUND" OR "APPROXIMATELY."

- AUTHOR LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. *BOOK TITLE*. CITY OF PUBLICATION: PUBLISHER, CA. YEAR.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- BROWN, SAMUEL. *EARLY AMERICAN CARTOGRAPHY*. BOSTON: COLONIAL MAPS, CA. 1750.

NO PUBLISHER OR PLACE OF PUBLICATION

WHILE NOT DIRECTLY ABOUT DATES, IT'S WORTH NOTING THAT IF THE PUBLISHER OR PLACE OF PUBLICATION IS ALSO MISSING, THESE ELEMENTS WOULD BE OMITTED OR HANDLED ACCORDING TO CMOS GUIDELINES, WITH THE DATE STILL BEING PLACED IN ITS DESIGNATED SPOT OR REPLACED WITH "N.D." OR "CA. YEAR."

VARIATIONS AND SPECIAL CASES FOR PUBLICATION DATES

BEYOND STANDARD BOOKS AND ARTICLES, CHICAGO STYLE ADDRESSES PUBLICATION DATES FOR A VARIETY OF OTHER SOURCE TYPES, EACH WITH ITS OWN SPECIFIC CONVENTIONS.

CITING LECTURES AND PRESENTATIONS

FOR UNPUBLISHED LECTURES OR PRESENTATIONS, THE DATE THEY WERE GIVEN IS CRUCIAL. THESE ARE OFTEN TREATED AS PERSONAL COMMUNICATIONS OR UNPUBLISHED WORKS.

- LECTURER LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. "TITLE OF LECTURE." (PAPER PRESENTED AT EVENT NAME, LOCATION, MONTH DAY, YEAR).

FOR EXAMPLE:

- GARCIA, MARIA. "THE FUTURE OF SUSTAINABLE CITIES." (PAPER PRESENTED AT THE URBAN PLANNING CONFERENCE, CHICAGO, IL, APRIL 15, 2022).

CITING INTERVIEWS

FOR INTERVIEWS, THE DATE THEY WERE CONDUCTED OR, IF PUBLISHED, THE DATE OF PUBLICATION OF THE INTERVIEW TRANSCRIPT IS ESSENTIAL.

- INTERVIEWEE LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. PERSONAL INTERVIEW BY INTERVIEWER FIRST NAME LAST NAME. MONTH DAY, YEAR. (IF UNPUBLISHED)

- INTERVIEWEE LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. "TITLE OF INTERVIEW." INTERVIEW BY INTERVIEWER FIRST NAME LAST NAME. *PUBLICATION TITLE*, MONTH DAY, YEAR. (IF PUBLISHED)

CITING GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS

GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS OFTEN HAVE PUBLICATION DATES THAT FOLLOW STANDARD BIBLIOGRAPHIC FORMATS, BUT THEIR SPECIFIC NAMING CONVENTIONS AND ISSUING AGENCIES CAN BE COMPLEX. THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION IS USUALLY A KEY ELEMENT.

- ISSUING AGENCY. *TITLE OF DOCUMENT*. CITY OF PUBLICATION: PUBLISHER (IF APPLICABLE), YEAR.

THE CONSISTENT AND ACCURATE REPORTING OF PUBLICATION DATES ACROSS ALL THESE FORMATS IS A TESTAMENT TO THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE'S COMMITMENT TO PROVIDING A CLEAR AND RELIABLE SYSTEM FOR ACADEMIC CITATION. BY UNDERSTANDING THESE EXAMPLES AND PRINCIPLES, WRITERS CAN ENSURE THEIR WORK IS BOTH CREDIBLE AND EASILY VERIFIABLE.

FAQ SECTION

Q: WHERE DOES THE PUBLICATION DATE TYPICALLY GO IN A CHICAGO STYLE CITATION?

A: IN CHICAGO STYLE (NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM), THE PUBLICATION DATE GENERALLY APPEARS AT THE END OF THE CITATION FOR BOOKS AND JOURNAL ARTICLES, AFTER THE PUBLISHER AND CITY OF PUBLICATION, AND BEFORE ANY PAGE NUMBERS FOR THE BIBLIOGRAPHY. FOR FOOTNOTES AND ENDNOTES, IT TYPICALLY APPEARS AFTER THE AUTHOR AND TITLE INFORMATION, ENCLOSED IN PARENTHESES ALONG WITH PUBLISHER DETAILS.

Q: WHAT IS THE ABBREVIATION FOR AN UNKNOWN PUBLICATION DATE IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: IF THE PUBLICATION DATE OF A SOURCE IS UNKNOWN, THE ABBREVIATION "N.D." (NO DATE) IS USED IN PLACE OF THE YEAR IN CHICAGO STYLE CITATIONS.

Q: HOW DO I CITE A SOURCE WITH AN APPROXIMATE PUBLICATION DATE IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: WHEN A PUBLICATION DATE IS APPROXIMATE, YOU USE THE ABBREVIATION "CA." (CIRCA) BEFORE THE YEAR, INDICATING "AROUND" OR "APPROXIMATELY." FOR EXAMPLE, "CA. 1950."

Q: DO I NEED TO INCLUDE THE MONTH AND DAY FOR NEWSPAPER AND MAGAZINE CITATIONS IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: YES, FOR NEWSPAPERS AND MAGAZINES, IT IS IMPORTANT TO INCLUDE THE FULL DATE OF PUBLICATION, INCLUDING THE MONTH AND DAY, TO SPECIFY THE EXACT ISSUE FROM WHICH THE INFORMATION IS DRAWN.

Q: HOW DO I CITE AN ONLINE ARTICLE WITHOUT A CLEAR PUBLICATION DATE?

A: FOR ONLINE ARTICLES WITHOUT A CLEAR PUBLICATION DATE, CHICAGO STYLE RECOMMENDS LOOKING FOR A LAST UPDATED DATE. IF NEITHER IS AVAILABLE, YOU MAY USE "N.D." AND OFTEN INCLUDE AN ACCESS DATE. HOWEVER, TRY TO LOCATE ANY DATE, EVEN IF IT'S FOR WEBSITE CONTENT RELATED TO THE ARTICLE.

Q: SHOULD I USE THE ORIGINAL PUBLICATION DATE OR THE EDITION'S PUBLICATION DATE WHEN CITING A BOOK WITH MULTIPLE EDITIONS?

A: YOU SHOULD CITE THE PUBLICATION DATE OF THE SPECIFIC EDITION YOU ARE USING. IF IT'S IMPORTANT FOR YOUR ARGUMENT, YOU CAN ALSO MENTION THE ORIGINAL PUBLICATION DATE, TYPICALLY IN PARENTHESES AFTER THE EDITION INFORMATION.

Q: HOW IS THE PUBLICATION DATE HANDLED DIFFERENTLY IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY VERSUS FOOTNOTES/ENDNOTES FOR CHICAGO STYLE?

A: WHILE THE INFORMATION IS LARGELY THE SAME, THE PLACEMENT AND PUNCTUATION OF THE PUBLICATION DATE CAN VARY. IN BIBLIOGRAPHIES, IT'S USUALLY AT THE END OF THE PUBLISHER INFORMATION. IN FOOTNOTES/ENDNOTES, IT'S OFTEN WITHIN PARENTHESES FOLLOWING THE PUBLISHER AND CITY. THE ORDER OF AUTHOR'S NAME ALSO DIFFERS (LAST, FIRST IN BIBLIOGRAPHY VS. FIRST LAST IN NOTES).

Q: WHAT IF A WEBSITE PROVIDES A COPYRIGHT DATE BUT NOT A SPECIFIC PUBLICATION DATE?

A: A COPYRIGHT DATE CAN BE USED AS A PUBLICATION DATE IF IT'S THE MOST RECENT DATE PROVIDED AND CLEARLY INDICATES WHEN THE CONTENT WAS MADE AVAILABLE. IT FUNCTIONS SIMILARLY TO A PUBLICATION DATE IN THIS CONTEXT.

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
