

CHICAGO MANUAL BLOCK QUOTE FORMATTING RULES

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE (CMOS) PROVIDES COMPREHENSIVE GUIDANCE ON HOW TO FORMAT BLOCK QUOTATIONS, ENSURING CLARITY, CONSISTENCY, AND PROFESSIONALISM IN ACADEMIC AND PUBLISHED WORKS. 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WHAT IS A BLOCK QUOTE?

A BLOCK QUOTE, ALSO KNOWN AS AN EXTENDED QUOTATION OR A DISPLAYED QUOTATION, IS A PASSAGE OF TEXT THAT IS SET APART FROM THE MAIN BODY OF YOUR WRITING DUE TO ITS LENGTH OR SIGNIFICANCE. UNLIKE SHORTER QUOTATIONS THAT ARE INTEGRATED DIRECTLY INTO YOUR PROSE AND ENCLOSED IN QUOTATION MARKS, BLOCK QUOTES ARE FORMATTED WITH DISTINCT INDENTATION AND SPACING TO VISUALLY SIGNAL THEIR SEPARATION. THIS STYLISTIC CHOICE SERVES TO DRAW THE READER'S ATTENTION TO THE QUOTED MATERIAL AND TO EMPHASIZE ITS IMPORTANCE WITHIN YOUR ARGUMENT OR ANALYSIS. THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE (CMOS) OUTLINES PRECISE SPECIFICATIONS FOR THEIR PRESENTATION, ENSURING A STANDARDIZED AND PROFESSIONAL APPEARANCE.

THE PRIMARY FUNCTION OF A BLOCK QUOTE IS TO PRESENT A SUBSTANTIAL PORTION OF ANOTHER AUTHOR'S WORK VERBATIM. THIS IS TYPICALLY DONE WHEN THE QUOTED MATERIAL IS LENGTHY, PARTICULARLY IMPACTFUL, OR REQUIRES DETAILED EXAMINATION. BY ISOLATING THE QUOTE, THE WRITER AVOIDS DISRUPTING THE FLOW OF THEIR OWN NARRATIVE OR ARGUMENT WITH A LENGTHY EXCERPT. CMOS RECOGNIZES BLOCK QUOTES AS A VALUABLE TOOL FOR AUTHORS TO SUPPORT THEIR CLAIMS WITH AUTHORITATIVE EVIDENCE, ENGAGE WITH EXISTING SCHOLARSHIP, OR PRESERVE THE ORIGINAL PHRASING OF A SIGNIFICANT STATEMENT.

WHEN TO USE A BLOCK QUOTE

THE DECISION TO USE A BLOCK QUOTE IS PRIMARILY DICTATED BY THE LENGTH OF THE MATERIAL YOU INTEND TO QUOTE. WHILE THERE ISN'T A UNIVERSALLY STRICT WORD COUNT THAT MANDATES A BLOCK QUOTE, THE GENERAL GUIDELINE IN THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE SUGGESTS THAT QUOTATIONS OF FIVE OR MORE FULL LINES OF PROSE OR THREE OR MORE LINES OF POETRY SHOULD BE FORMATTED AS BLOCK QUOTES. THIS THRESHOLD IS NOT ARBITRARY; IT REFLECTS A PRACTICAL CONSIDERATION OF READABILITY. WHEN A QUOTE EXCEEDS THIS LENGTH, EMBEDDING IT DIRECTLY INTO YOUR PARAGRAPHS CAN OVERWHELM THE READER AND DETRACT FROM YOUR OWN VOICE AND ANALYSIS. SETTING IT APART AS A BLOCK QUOTE MAKES IT EASIER TO DIGEST AND ANALYZE.

BEYOND MERE LENGTH, THE CONTENT AND SIGNIFICANCE OF THE PASSAGE ALSO PLAY A ROLE IN DETERMINING WHETHER A BLOCK QUOTE IS APPROPRIATE. IF THE QUOTED TEXT IS PARTICULARLY DENSE, COMPLEX, OR CENTRAL TO YOUR ARGUMENT, ISOLATING IT AS A BLOCK QUOTE CAN HELP YOUR READERS FOCUS ON ITS SPECIFIC CONTENT WITHOUT THE SURROUNDING PROSE. FOR INSTANCE, A CRUCIAL PIECE OF EVIDENCE, A FOUNDATIONAL DEFINITION, OR A HIGHLY INFLUENTIAL PASSAGE FROM ANOTHER

SCHOLAR MIGHT WARRANT BLOCK QUOTE TREATMENT EVEN IF IT FALLS JUST SHY OF THE TYPICAL LINE COUNT, PROVIDED ITS IMPORTANCE JUSTIFIES THE VISUAL SEPARATION AND EMPHASIS IT RECEIVES.

DISTINGUISHING BLOCK QUOTES FROM INLINE QUOTATIONS

THE FUNDAMENTAL DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A BLOCK QUOTE AND AN INLINE QUOTATION LIES IN THEIR PRESENTATION AND PURPOSE WITHIN THE TEXT. INLINE QUOTATIONS ARE BRIEF EXCERPTS, TYPICALLY ONE OR TWO SENTENCES, THAT ARE SEAMLESSLY INTEGRATED INTO THE WRITER'S OWN SENTENCES AND ENCLOSED IN DOUBLE QUOTATION MARKS. THEY ARE MEANT TO BE WOVEN INTO THE FABRIC OF YOUR PROSE, SERVING AS BRIEF POINTS OF REFERENCE OR SUPPORT. IN CONTRAST, BLOCK QUOTES ARE SET APART TYPOGRAPHICALLY, USUALLY BY INDENTATION, TO SIGNIFY A MORE SUBSTANTIAL OR DISTINCT PIECE OF TEXTUAL MATERIAL. THIS VISUAL SEPARATION CLEARLY SIGNALS THAT THE READER IS ENGAGING WITH A PASSAGE FROM ANOTHER SOURCE IN ITS ENTIRETY, RATHER THAN A SNIPPET BEING USED TO ILLUSTRATE A POINT WITHIN THE WRITER'S OWN ONGOING THOUGHT.

THE STYLISTIC IMPLICATIONS ARE ALSO SIGNIFICANT. INLINE QUOTES ARE DESIGNED TO BE UNOBTRUSIVE, MAINTAINING THE FLOW OF THE WRITER'S ARGUMENT. BLOCK QUOTES, BY THEIR VERY NATURE, DRAW ATTENTION. THEIR FORMATTING SIGNALS THEIR IMPORTANCE AND INVITES A CLOSER LOOK. WHEN SELECTING BETWEEN AN INLINE AND BLOCK QUOTE, CONSIDER HOW THE EXCERPT FUNCTIONS WITHIN YOUR WRITING. IF IT SERVES AS A CONCISE ILLUSTRATION OR A BRIEF PIECE OF EVIDENCE, AN INLINE QUOTE IS APPROPRIATE. IF IT IS A SIGNIFICANT PASSAGE THAT REQUIRES CAREFUL CONSIDERATION OR FORMS A SUBSTANTIAL PART OF YOUR SOURCE MATERIAL ANALYSIS, A BLOCK QUOTE IS THE MORE EFFECTIVE CHOICE.

INDENTATION AND SPACING FOR BLOCK QUOTES

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE SPECIFIES CLEAR RULES FOR INDENTING BLOCK QUOTES TO DISTINGUISH THEM FROM THE MAIN TEXT. THE STANDARD PRACTICE IS TO INDENT THE ENTIRE BLOCK QUOTE ONE-HALF INCH FROM THE LEFT MARGIN. THIS INDENTATION APPLIES TO EVERY LINE OF THE QUOTATION, ENSURING A UNIFORM APPEARANCE. CRUCIALLY, THE RIGHT MARGIN OF THE BLOCK QUOTE SHOULD ALIGN WITH THE RIGHT MARGIN OF YOUR REGULAR TEXT; NO ADDITIONAL RIGHT-HAND INDENTATION IS TYPICALLY REQUIRED UNLESS SPECIFIC CIRCUMSTANCES OR PUBLICATION GUIDELINES DICTATE OTHERWISE. THIS CONSISTENT INDENTATION IS KEY TO VISUALLY SETTING THE QUOTE APART AND SIGNALING ITS DISTINCT STATUS.

SPACING AROUND BLOCK QUOTES IS ALSO IMPORTANT FOR READABILITY AND ADHERENCE TO CMOS. A GENERAL RULE IS TO LEAVE A FULL BLANK LINE ABOVE AND BELOW THE BLOCK QUOTATION. THIS EXTRA WHITE SPACE FURTHER EMPHASIZES THE SEPARATION BETWEEN THE QUOTED MATERIAL AND YOUR OWN TEXT, ALLOWING THE READER'S EYE TO REST AND MENTALLY SHIFT FOCUS. IF THE BLOCK QUOTE ITSELF CONTAINS MULTIPLE PARAGRAPHS, EACH NEW PARAGRAPH WITHIN THE BLOCK QUOTE SHOULD BE INDENTED AN ADDITIONAL ONE-HALF INCH FROM THE LEFT MARGIN, MIRRORING THE INDENTATION OF THE MAIN TEXT'S PARAGRAPHS. THIS INTERNAL PARAGRAPHING WITHIN THE BLOCK QUOTE PRESERVES THE ORIGINAL STRUCTURE OF THE QUOTED MATERIAL.

HANDLING PUNCTUATION AND QUOTATION MARKS IN BLOCK QUOTES

A KEY FEATURE OF CHICAGO MANUAL BLOCK QUOTE FORMATTING RULES IS HOW PUNCTUATION AND QUOTATION MARKS ARE TREATED. FOR BLOCK QUOTES, THE CLOSING PUNCTUATION MARK (SUCH AS A PERIOD, QUESTION MARK, OR EXCLAMATION POINT) THAT ENDS THE QUOTATION SHOULD BE PLACED DIRECTLY AFTER THE LAST WORD OF THE QUOTE. UNLIKE INLINE QUOTATIONS WHERE TERMINAL PUNCTUATION MIGHT SOMETIMES BE INCORPORATED INTO THE CITATION, FOR BLOCK QUOTES, THE PUNCTUATION BELONGS TO THE QUOTED TEXT ITSELF AND PRECEDES ANY CITATION INFORMATION. THIS MAINTAINS THE INTEGRITY OF THE ORIGINAL SENTENCE STRUCTURE AND ITS CONCLUDING PUNCTUATION.

REGARDING QUOTATION MARKS, THE GENERAL RULE FOR BLOCK QUOTES IS THAT THEY DO NOT USE QUOTATION MARKS AROUND THE ENTIRE BLOCK. THE INDENTATION AND SPACING THEMSELVES SERVE AS THE VISUAL CUE THAT THE TEXT IS A QUOTATION. THEREFORE, YOU SHOULD NOT PLACE DOUBLE QUOTATION MARKS AT THE BEGINNING OR END OF A BLOCK QUOTE. THIS

OMISSION HELPS TO VISUALLY DIFFERENTIATE THE BLOCK QUOTE FROM INLINE QUOTATIONS, WHICH DO REQUIRE QUOTATION MARKS. HOWEVER, IF THE ORIGINAL SOURCE MATERIAL CONTAINED INTERNAL QUOTATION MARKS WITHIN THE PASSAGE YOU ARE QUOTING, THOSE INTERNAL QUOTATION MARKS SHOULD BE RETAINED IN YOUR BLOCK QUOTE TO ACCURATELY REPRESENT THE SOURCE.

CITING BLOCK QUOTES ACCORDING TO CHICAGO STYLE

ACCURATE CITATION IS PARAMOUNT WHEN USING BLOCK QUOTES, AND THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE PROVIDES SPECIFIC GUIDELINES. THE CITATION FOR A BLOCK QUOTE TYPICALLY FOLLOWS THE PUNCTUATION THAT ENDS THE QUOTED MATERIAL. IN MOST CASES, THIS MEANS THE CITATION APPEARS IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE FINAL PERIOD, QUESTION MARK, OR EXCLAMATION POINT OF THE QUOTED PASSAGE. THE FORMAT OF THE CITATION WILL DEPEND ON WHETHER YOU ARE USING NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY OR AUTHOR-DATE CITATION, BUT THE PLACEMENT REMAINS CONSISTENT: AT THE END OF THE QUOTED TEXT.

WHEN USING THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THE CITATION FOR A BLOCK QUOTE WILL TYPICALLY BE A FOOTNOTE OR ENDNOTE NUMBER PLACED DIRECTLY AFTER THE TERMINAL PUNCTUATION OF THE QUOTE. THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION WILL THEN BE PROVIDED IN THE CORRESPONDING NOTE AND IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY AT THE END OF THE WORK. FOR AUTHOR-DATE CITATIONS, YOU WILL USUALLY INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION, AND THE PAGE NUMBER WITHIN PARENTHESES, PLACED AFTER THE TERMINAL PUNCTUATION. FOR EXAMPLE: (SMITH 2023, 123). REGARDLESS OF THE CITATION SYSTEM, ENSURING THAT THE CITATION CLEARLY AND UNAMBIGUOUSLY POINTS TO THE SOURCE MATERIAL IS THE PRIMARY GOAL.

FOOTNOTE AND ENDNOTE PLACEMENT FOR BLOCK QUOTES

IN THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM OF CHICAGO STYLE, THE PLACEMENT OF THE FOOTNOTE OR ENDNOTE NUMBER FOR A BLOCK QUOTE IS CRITICAL FOR PROPER ATTRIBUTION. THE NUMBER SHOULD BE PLACED DIRECTLY AFTER THE FINAL PUNCTUATION MARK OF THE QUOTED TEXT. FOR INSTANCE, IF THE BLOCK QUOTE ENDS WITH A PERIOD, THE FOOTNOTE NUMBER SHOULD IMMEDIATELY FOLLOW THAT PERIOD, WITH NO SPACE IN BETWEEN. THIS CONVENTION ENSURES THAT THE CITATION IS DIRECTLY ASSOCIATED WITH THE SPECIFIC WORDS BEING QUOTED, PREVENTING ANY AMBIGUITY ABOUT WHICH PART OF THE TEXT IS BEING REFERENCED.

IT IS ESSENTIAL TO REMEMBER THAT EACH DISTINCT BLOCK QUOTE SHOULD RECEIVE ITS OWN CITATION, EVEN IF MULTIPLE QUOTES ARE TAKEN FROM THE SAME SOURCE. IF A BLOCK QUOTE SPANS MULTIPLE PAGES OF THE ORIGINAL SOURCE, YOU SHOULD CITE THE FIRST PAGE WHERE THE QUOTATION BEGINS OR THE PAGE WHERE THE BLOCK QUOTE ITSELF APPEARS IN YOUR TEXT. THE AIM IS TO PROVIDE SUFFICIENT INFORMATION FOR YOUR READER TO LOCATE THE PRECISE SOURCE OF THE MATERIAL YOU HAVE USED. CONSULTING THE LATEST EDITION OF THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE IS ALWAYS RECOMMENDED FOR THE MOST CURRENT AND DETAILED GUIDANCE ON CITATION PRACTICES.

HANDLING BLOCK QUOTES WITHIN BLOCK QUOTES

OCCASIONALLY, THE MATERIAL YOU WISH TO QUOTE AS A BLOCK QUOTE MAY ITSELF CONTAIN SHORTER QUOTATIONS. THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE ADDRESSES THIS SCENARIO TO MAINTAIN CLARITY AND ACCURACY. IF A PASSAGE YOU ARE PRESENTING AS A BLOCK QUOTE INCLUDES INLINE QUOTATIONS, THOSE INLINE QUOTATIONS SHOULD RETAIN THEIR ORIGINAL QUOTATION MARKS. THE PURPOSE HERE IS TO PRESERVE THE INTEGRITY OF THE SOURCE MATERIAL; IF THE ORIGINAL AUTHOR USED QUOTATION MARKS FOR A SPECIFIC PHRASE OR SENTENCE WITHIN THE LARGER PASSAGE, THOSE MARKS SHOULD APPEAR IN YOUR RENDITION.

WHEN A BLOCK QUOTE NEEDS TO CONTAIN ANOTHER BLOCK QUOTE (A RARE BUT POSSIBLE OCCURRENCE), THE INTERIOR BLOCK QUOTE IS TYPICALLY INDENTED FURTHER THAN THE OUTER BLOCK QUOTE. THIS CREATES A VISUAL HIERARCHY, CLEARLY DISTINGUISHING THE NESTED QUOTATION. THE OUTER BLOCK QUOTE FOLLOWS ITS STANDARD INDENTATION, AND THEN THE INTERIOR BLOCK QUOTE IS INDENTED AN ADDITIONAL ONE-HALF INCH FROM THE LEFT MARGIN OF THE OUTER BLOCK QUOTE. BOTH

BLOCK QUOTES WOULD OMIT SURROUNDING QUOTATION MARKS. THIS LAYERED INDENTATION IS A SOPHISTICATED WAY TO REPRESENT COMPLEX TEXTUAL RELATIONSHIPS AND SHOULD BE USED JUDICIOUSLY.

STYLISTIC CONSIDERATIONS FOR EXTENDED QUOTATIONS

THE EFFECTIVE USE OF BLOCK QUOTES EXTENDS BEYOND MERE ADHERENCE TO FORMATTING RULES; IT INVOLVES THOUGHTFUL STYLISTIC CONSIDERATION. BLOCK QUOTES SHOULD ALWAYS SERVE A CLEAR PURPOSE IN ADVANCING YOUR ARGUMENT OR ANALYSIS. THEY SHOULD NOT BE USED AS A SUBSTITUTE FOR YOUR OWN WRITING OR TO PAD THE LENGTH OF YOUR WORK. EACH BLOCK QUOTE SHOULD BE CAREFULLY INTRODUCED AND FOLLOWED BY YOUR OWN COMMENTARY, EXPLAINING ITS RELEVANCE AND SIGNIFICANCE. THE SURROUNDING PROSE SHOULD CONTEXTUALIZE THE QUOTE, GUIDING THE READER TOWARD UNDERSTANDING ITS IMPLICATIONS.

FURTHERMORE, THE LENGTH OF A BLOCK QUOTE SHOULD BE PROPORTIONATE TO ITS IMPORTANCE. WHILE CMOS PROVIDES GUIDELINES ON WHEN TO USE A BLOCK QUOTE, AUTHORS MUST ALSO EXERCISE JUDGMENT. AN EXCESSIVELY LONG BLOCK QUOTE, EVEN IF CORRECTLY FORMATTED, CAN DISRUPT THE READER'S ENGAGEMENT WITH YOUR OWN IDEAS. CONSIDER WHETHER A SHORTER, WELL-CHOSEN EXCERPT MIGHT SUFFICE, OR IF PARAPHRASING WITH A CITATION WOULD BE MORE EFFECTIVE. THE GOAL IS TO INTEGRATE SOURCE MATERIAL SEAMLESSLY AND PURPOSEFULLY, ENHANCING YOUR OWN CONTRIBUTION RATHER THAN OVERSHADOWING IT.

THE ROLE OF BLOCK QUOTES IN ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL WRITING

IN ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL WRITING, BLOCK QUOTES SERVE A VITAL FUNCTION IN ESTABLISHING CREDIBILITY AND SUPPORTING ARGUMENTS WITH EVIDENCE. BY QUOTING DIRECTLY FROM AUTHORITATIVE SOURCES, WRITERS DEMONSTRATE THAT THEY HAVE ENGAGED WITH EXISTING SCHOLARSHIP AND ARE BUILDING UPON A FOUNDATION OF ESTABLISHED KNOWLEDGE. THIS IS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT IN FIELDS WHERE PRECISE LANGUAGE AND FOUNDATIONAL TEXTS ARE CRUCIAL. THE ACT OF PRESENTING A BLOCK QUOTE SIGNALS TO THE READER THAT THE QUOTED MATERIAL IS OF SUCH IMPORTANCE THAT IT WARRANTS DIRECT ATTENTION, OFTEN BECAUSE IT REPRESENTS A KEY DEFINITION, A SEMINAL ARGUMENT, OR A PIECE OF EVIDENCE THAT IS CENTRAL TO THE WRITER'S THESIS.

MASTERY OF CHICAGO MANUAL BLOCK QUOTE FORMATTING RULES ENSURES THAT THESE CRITICAL PIECES OF EVIDENCE ARE PRESENTED IN A MANNER THAT IS BOTH PROFESSIONAL AND EASILY DIGESTIBLE. CORRECT FORMATTING AVOIDS DISTRACTIONS, ALLOWING THE READER TO FOCUS ON THE CONTENT OF THE QUOTE AND THE WRITER'S ANALYSIS OF IT. ULTIMATELY, THE SKILLFUL AND APPROPRIATE USE OF BLOCK QUOTES, GUIDED BY THE PRINCIPLES OUTLINED IN THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE, STRENGTHENS AN AUTHOR'S WORK, ENHANCES ITS PERSUASIVE POWER, AND CONTRIBUTES TO THE OVERALL CLARITY AND COHERENCE OF THE PRESENTED ARGUMENT.

ENHANCING CREDIBILITY WITH DIRECT QUOTATIONS

THE STRATEGIC USE OF BLOCK QUOTES CAN SIGNIFICANTLY BOLSTER THE CREDIBILITY OF AN AUTHOR'S WORK. WHEN READERS ENCOUNTER WELL-FORMATTED AND APPROPRIATELY CITED BLOCK QUOTES, THEY UNDERSTAND THAT THE AUTHOR IS GROUNDING THEIR CLAIMS IN EXTERNAL AUTHORITY AND IS NOT MERELY PRESENTING PERSONAL OPINIONS OR INTERPRETATIONS WITHOUT SUPPORT. BY PRESENTING EXTENDED PASSAGES VERBATIM, AUTHORS ALLOW THE ORIGINAL VOICE AND NUANCE OF THEIR SOURCES TO SPEAK DIRECTLY TO THE READER, FOSTERING A SENSE OF AUTHENTICITY AND DEPTH IN THE RESEARCH.

MOREOVER, CORRECT FORMATTING ACCORDING TO THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE DEMONSTRATES ATTENTION TO DETAIL AND A COMMITMENT TO PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS. READERS ACCUSTOMED TO THESE CONVENTIONS WILL RECOGNIZE AND APPRECIATE THE ADHERENCE TO ESTABLISHED GUIDELINES. FAQ SECTION

Q: WHAT IS THE PRIMARY GUIDELINE FOR DETERMINING WHEN TO USE A BLOCK QUOTE IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: THE PRIMARY GUIDELINE FOR DETERMINING WHEN TO USE A BLOCK QUOTE IN CHICAGO STYLE IS THE LENGTH OF THE QUOTATION. GENERALLY, PASSAGES OF FIVE OR MORE FULL LINES OF PROSE OR THREE OR MORE LINES OF POETRY SHOULD BE FORMATTED AS BLOCK QUOTES.

Q: DO BLOCK QUOTES IN CHICAGO STYLE REQUIRE QUOTATION MARKS AROUND THEM?

A: NO, BLOCK QUOTES IN CHICAGO STYLE DO NOT REQUIRE QUOTATION MARKS AROUND THE ENTIRE BLOCK. THE INDENTATION AND SEPARATION FROM THE MAIN TEXT SERVE AS THE VISUAL INDICATOR THAT IT IS A QUOTATION.

Q: HOW IS A BLOCK QUOTE INDENTED ACCORDING TO THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE?

A: ACCORDING TO THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE, A BLOCK QUOTE IS TYPICALLY INDENTED ONE-HALF INCH FROM THE LEFT MARGIN. EVERY LINE OF THE BLOCK QUOTE SHOULD MAINTAIN THIS INDENTATION.

Q: WHERE SHOULD THE CITATION FOR A BLOCK QUOTE BE PLACED IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: THE CITATION FOR A BLOCK QUOTE IN CHICAGO STYLE IS USUALLY PLACED IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE TERMINAL PUNCTUATION MARK (PERIOD, QUESTION MARK, OR EXCLAMATION POINT) THAT CONCLUDES THE QUOTED MATERIAL.

Q: SHOULD PARAGRAPHS WITHIN A BLOCK QUOTE BE INDENTED?

A: YES, IF THE ORIGINAL QUOTED MATERIAL CONTAINS MULTIPLE PARAGRAPHS, EACH NEW PARAGRAPH WITHIN THE BLOCK QUOTE SHOULD BE INDENTED AN ADDITIONAL ONE-HALF INCH FROM THE LEFT MARGIN OF THE BLOCK QUOTE ITSELF.

Q: WHAT HAPPENS IF A BLOCK QUOTE CONTAINS INTERNAL QUOTATION MARKS?

A: IF THE ORIGINAL SOURCE MATERIAL FOR A BLOCK QUOTE INCLUDES INTERNAL QUOTATION MARKS, THOSE QUOTATION MARKS SHOULD BE RETAINED IN YOUR BLOCK QUOTE TO ACCURATELY REFLECT THE ORIGINAL TEXT.

Q: CAN I USE A BLOCK QUOTE TO PRESENT A DEFINITION FROM A DICTIONARY IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: WHILE CHICAGO STYLE HAS SPECIFIC RULES FOR DICTIONARY ENTRIES, IF A DEFINITION IS EXCEPTIONALLY LONG OR CRUCIAL TO YOUR ARGUMENT AND EXCEEDS THE GENERAL LINE COUNT FOR BLOCK QUOTES, YOU MAY PRESENT IT AS A BLOCK QUOTE, FOLLOWING ALL APPLICABLE FORMATTING AND CITATION GUIDELINES.

Q: HOW DO BLOCK QUOTES DIFFER FROM INLINE QUOTATIONS IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: BLOCK QUOTES ARE LONGER, SET APART BY INDENTATION AND SPACING, AND DO NOT USE SURROUNDING QUOTATION MARKS, WHEREAS INLINE QUOTATIONS ARE SHORTER, INTEGRATED INTO THE TEXT WITH QUOTATION MARKS, AND ARE NOT INDENTED.

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
