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UNDERSTANDING THE PURPOSE OF FIGURE NUMBERING

THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF FIGURE NUMBERING IN ANY ACADEMIC DOCUMENT, ESPECIALLY A THESIS, IS TO FACILITATE EASY REFERENCE AND CLEAR COMMUNICATION. CONSISTENT AND LOGICAL NUMBERING ALLOWS READERS TO LOCATE SPECIFIC ILLUSTRATIONS, CHARTS, GRAPHS, OR IMAGES QUICKLY AND EFFICIENTLY. THIS SYSTEMATIC APPROACH IS NOT MERELY AN AESTHETIC CHOICE; IT DIRECTLY IMPACTS THE READER'S ABILITY TO FOLLOW YOUR ARGUMENTS AND COMPREHEND YOUR DATA.

IN THE CONTEXT OF THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE, FIGURE NUMBERING SERVES AS A VITAL ORGANIZATIONAL TOOL. IT CREATES A UNIQUE IDENTIFIER FOR EACH VISUAL ELEMENT, ENABLING SEAMLESS INTEGRATION INTO THE TEXT THROUGH IN-TEXT CITATIONS AND A DEDICATED LIST OF FIGURES. WITHOUT THIS CLEAR NUMBERING SYSTEM, A THESIS LADEN WITH VISUAL AIDS WOULD BECOME DISORGANIZED AND DIFFICULT TO NAVIGATE, POTENTIALLY HINDERING THE READER'S UNDERSTANDING OF YOUR RESEARCH FINDINGS.

KEY PRINCIPLES OF CHICAGO STYLE FIGURE NUMBERING

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE EMPHASIZES CLARITY, CONSISTENCY, AND SIMPLICITY IN ITS GUIDELINES FOR FIGURE NUMBERING. THE CORE PRINCIPLE IS TO ASSIGN A UNIQUE, SEQUENTIAL NUMBER TO EACH FIGURE WITHIN THE DOCUMENT. WHILE VARIATIONS EXIST, THE MOST COMMON APPROACH DICTATES THAT FIGURES SHOULD BE NUMBERED CONSECUTIVELY THROUGHOUT THE ENTIRE THESIS, STARTING WITH "FIGURE 1" AND CONTINUING SEQUENTIALLY TO THE LAST FIGURE.

A CRUCIAL ASPECT OF CHICAGO STYLE IS ITS FLEXIBILITY REGARDING CHAPTER-SPECIFIC NUMBERING. WHILE NOT THE DEFAULT FOR THESES, SOME INSTITUTIONS OR DEPARTMENTS MAY REQUEST CHAPTER-BASED NUMBERING (E.G., FIGURE 1.1, FIGURE 1.2 FOR CHAPTER 1). HOWEVER, THE STANDARD CMOS RECOMMENDATION FOR A SINGLE, CONTINUOUS SEQUENCE IS GENERALLY PREFERRED FOR ITS STRAIGHTFORWARDNESS UNLESS EXPLICITLY STATED OTHERWISE BY YOUR ACADEMIC INSTITUTION. ALWAYS CONSULT YOUR UNIVERSITY'S SPECIFIC STYLE GUIDE IN CONJUNCTION WITH CMOS.

ANOTHER FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLE IS THE CLEAR IDENTIFICATION OF EACH FIGURE. EVERY FIGURE MUST HAVE A CAPTION THAT INCLUDES ITS NUMBER AND A DESCRIPTIVE TITLE. THIS CAPTION SHOULD BE PLACED DIRECTLY BELOW THE FIGURE ITSELF. THE NUMBERING SHOULD BE DISTINCT AND EASILY DISTINGUISHABLE FROM OTHER ELEMENTS LIKE TABLES OR EQUATIONS, WHICH HAVE THEIR OWN SEPARATE NUMBERING SYSTEMS.

CONSECUTIVE NUMBERING THROUGHOUT THE THESIS

THE MOST WIDELY ADOPTED METHOD FOR FIGURE NUMBERING IN CHICAGO STYLE IS TO ASSIGN CONSECUTIVE NUMBERS TO ALL FIGURES WITHIN THE THESIS. THIS MEANS THE FIRST FIGURE ENCOUNTERED, REGARDLESS OF ITS CHAPTER LOCATION, IS LABELED "FIGURE 1." THE SUBSEQUENT FIGURE BECOMES "FIGURE 2," AND SO FORTH, UNTIL THE FINAL VISUAL ELEMENT IN THE DOCUMENT. THIS UNBROKEN SEQUENCE SIMPLIFIES REFERENCING AND AVOIDS POTENTIAL CONFUSION THAT CAN ARISE FROM MORE COMPLEX NUMBERING SCHEMES.

DISTINCTION FROM OTHER VISUAL ELEMENTS

IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT FIGURES ARE CLEARLY DIFFERENTIATED FROM OTHER TYPES OF VISUAL CONTENT WITHIN A THESIS. CHICAGO STYLE, AND ACADEMIC WRITING IN GENERAL, MAINTAINS SEPARATE NUMBERING SYSTEMS FOR FIGURES, TABLES, AND EQUATIONS. FIGURES ARE RESERVED FOR ILLUSTRATIONS, GRAPHS, CHARTS, MAPS, AND PHOTOGRAPHS. TABLES ARE USED FOR PRESENTING DATA IN ROWS AND COLUMNS. EQUATIONS ARE TYPICALLY NUMBERED SEPARATELY AS WELL. THIS DISTINCT CATEGORIZATION ENSURES THAT READERS CAN EASILY IDENTIFY THE TYPE OF VISUAL INFORMATION THEY ARE ENCOUNTERING AND REFERENCE IT ACCURATELY.

DETAILED FORMATTING GUIDELINES FOR FIGURES

ADHERING TO SPECIFIC FORMATTING GUIDELINES IS ESSENTIAL FOR MAINTAINING A PROFESSIONAL AND CONSISTENT PRESENTATION OF YOUR FIGURES. THESE GUIDELINES ENCOMPASS THE PLACEMENT OF THE FIGURE NUMBER, THE FIGURE ITSELF, AND ITS CAPTION, ENSURING THAT EVERY VISUAL ELEMENT ADHERES TO THE ESTABLISHED STANDARD.

THE PLACEMENT OF THE FIGURE NUMBER AND CAPTION IS CRITICAL. TYPICALLY, THE FIGURE NUMBER AND ITS ACCOMPANYING DESCRIPTIVE TITLE ARE POSITIONED ABOVE THE FIGURE. HOWEVER, CMOS ALSO ALLOWS FOR THE CAPTION TO BE PLACED BELOW THE FIGURE, ESPECIALLY IF THE FIGURE ITSELF IS VERY LARGE OR COMPLEX. THE KEY IS CONSISTENCY THROUGHOUT YOUR DOCUMENT.

PLACEMENT OF FIGURE NUMBERS AND CAPTIONS

IN MOST INSTANCES, THE FIGURE NUMBER AND ITS TITLE SHOULD APPEAR DIRECTLY ABOVE THE VISUAL ELEMENT. FOR EXAMPLE, IT WOULD LOOK LIKE:

FIGURE 1. A GRAPH ILLUSTRATING THE TREND OF X OVER TIME.

THE FIGURE NUMBER ITSELF IS USUALLY BOLDDED OR ITALICIZED, FOLLOWED BY A PERIOD, AND THEN THE DESCRIPTIVE TITLE IN PLAIN TEXT OR ITALICIZED, DEPENDING ON THE SPECIFIC NUANCE OF THE CAPTION YOU WISH TO CONVEY. CONSISTENCY IN THIS FORMATTING CHOICE ACROSS ALL FIGURES IN YOUR THESIS IS PARAMOUNT.

CAPTION CONTENT AND STYLE

EACH FIGURE MUST HAVE A CLEAR AND CONCISE CAPTION THAT SERVES TO EXPLAIN ITS CONTENT. THE CAPTION BEGINS WITH THE FIGURE NUMBER (E.G., "FIGURE 1."), FOLLOWED BY A DESCRIPTIVE TITLE THAT SUMMARIZES WHAT THE FIGURE REPRESENTS. ADDITIONAL EXPLANATORY TEXT CAN BE INCLUDED IN THE CAPTION TO PROVIDE CONTEXT, DEFINE ABBREVIATIONS, OR EXPLAIN SPECIFIC DATA POINTS. THE STYLE OF THE CAPTION, INCLUDING FONT AND SPACING, SHOULD ALIGN WITH THE MAIN TEXT OF YOUR THESIS FOR VISUAL HARMONY.

RESOLUTION AND QUALITY OF FIGURES

WHILE NOT STRICTLY A NUMBERING ISSUE, THE QUALITY OF YOUR FIGURES DIRECTLY IMPACTS THEIR EFFECTIVENESS. ENSURE THAT ALL FIGURES, WHETHER GENERATED DIGITALLY OR SCANNED, ARE OF HIGH RESOLUTION AND CLARITY. BLURRY OR PIXELATED IMAGES DETRACT FROM THE PROFESSIONALISM OF YOUR THESIS AND CAN MAKE IT DIFFICULT FOR READERS TO INTERPRET THE VISUAL INFORMATION. IF YOU ARE SUBMITTING A DIGITAL VERSION, ENSURE THE FILE FORMATS ARE COMPATIBLE WITH COMMON VIEWING SOFTWARE AND THAT IMAGES ARE NOT OVERLY COMPRESSED.

NUMBERING STRATEGIES AND COMMON SCENARIOS

WHILE CONSECUTIVE NUMBERING IS THE MOST COMMON APPROACH, UNDERSTANDING ALTERNATIVE STRATEGIES AND HOW TO HANDLE SPECIFIC SCENARIOS CAN BE BENEFICIAL. THESE SITUATIONS OFTEN ARISE IN COMPLEX THESES OR WHEN SPECIFIC DEPARTMENTAL REQUIREMENTS COME INTO PLAY.

CHAPTER-BASED NUMBERING IS A FREQUENT ALTERNATIVE, ESPECIALLY IN THESES SUBMITTED TO UNIVERSITIES WITH ESTABLISHED DEPARTMENTAL STYLES. IN THIS SYSTEM, FIGURES ARE NUMBERED SEQUENTIALLY WITHIN EACH CHAPTER. FOR INSTANCE, THE FIRST FIGURE IN CHAPTER 1 WOULD BE "FIGURE 1.1," THE SECOND "FIGURE 1.2," AND SO ON. WHEN MOVING TO CHAPTER 2, THE NUMBERING WOULD RESET TO "FIGURE 2.1," "FIGURE 2.2," AND SO FORTH.

CHAPTER-BASED NUMBERING (IF REQUIRED)

IF YOUR INSTITUTION OR SUPERVISOR MANDATES CHAPTER-BASED NUMBERING, EACH FIGURE WILL BE PREFIXED WITH ITS CHAPTER NUMBER. THE FORMAT TYPICALLY LOOKS LIKE "FIGURE [CHAPTER NUMBER].[FIGURE NUMBER WITHIN CHAPTER]." FOR EXAMPLE, THE THIRD FIGURE IN CHAPTER 3 WOULD BE DENOTED AS "FIGURE 3.3." THIS METHOD CAN BE USEFUL FOR ORGANIZING LARGE AND COMPLEX THESES, AS IT GROUPS VISUAL ELEMENTS BY THEIR IMMEDIATE CONTEXT WITHIN THE RESEARCH NARRATIVE. HOWEVER, ALWAYS CONFIRM THIS IS THE PREFERRED METHOD BEFORE IMPLEMENTING IT.

HANDLING MULTIPLE FIGURES ON A SINGLE PAGE

WHEN YOU HAVE MULTIPLE RELATED FIGURES THAT ARE PRESENTED TOGETHER ON A SINGLE PAGE, THEY CAN BE TREATED AS SUB-FIGURES. CMOS ALLOWS FOR THIS BY USING LETTERS (A, B, C, ETC.) IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MAIN FIGURE NUMBER. FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU HAVE A COMPOSITE FIGURE MADE UP OF THREE PARTS, THEY MIGHT BE LABELED AS "FIGURE 5A," "FIGURE 5B," AND "FIGURE 5C." THE MAIN CAPTION WOULD THEN DESCRIBE THE ENTIRE COMPOSITE FIGURE, AND INDIVIDUAL CAPTIONS MIGHT BE PROVIDED FOR EACH SUB-FIGURE IF NECESSARY.

REFERENCING FIGURES IN THE TEXT

ACCURATE IN-TEXT REFERENCING OF YOUR FIGURES IS CRUCIAL. WHEN YOU REFER TO A FIGURE IN YOUR WRITING, YOU SHOULD USE ITS NUMBER. FOR EXAMPLE, "AS SHOWN IN FIGURE 3, THERE WAS A SIGNIFICANT INCREASE IN DATA POINTS" OR "THE TREND ILLUSTRATED IN FIGURE 7B INDICATES A CLEAR CORRELATION." CONSISTENCY IN HOW YOU REFER TO FIGURES—WHETHER YOU SPELL OUT "FIGURE" OR USE AN ABBREVIATION (THOUGH SPELLING OUT IS GENERALLY PREFERRED IN CMOS UNLESS IN TABLES)—IS IMPORTANT. IF USING CHAPTER-BASED NUMBERING, ENSURE YOUR IN-TEXT CITATIONS REFLECT THAT SYSTEM ACCURATELY.

INTEGRATING FIGURES INTO YOUR THESIS

THE SEAMLESS INTEGRATION OF FIGURES INTO THE BODY OF YOUR THESIS ENHANCES THE FLOW OF YOUR RESEARCH AND STRENGTHENS YOUR ARGUMENTS. FIGURES SHOULD NOT APPEAR AS ISOLATED ELEMENTS; THEY SHOULD BE INTRODUCED AND DISCUSSED WITHIN THE TEXT, PROVIDING VISUAL SUPPORT FOR YOUR WRITTEN NARRATIVE. THE PLACEMENT OF FIGURES RELATIVE TO THEIR FIRST MENTION IN THE TEXT IS A KEY CONSIDERATION.

GENERALLY, A FIGURE SHOULD APPEAR AS CLOSE AS POSSIBLE TO ITS FIRST MENTION IN THE TEXT. IDEALLY, IT SHOULD BE

PLACED ON THE SAME PAGE OR THE IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING PAGE. THIS PROXIMITY ENSURES THAT THE READER CAN EASILY REFER TO THE VISUAL AID WHILE ENGAGING WITH THE ACCOMPANYING DISCUSSION, THEREBY AVOIDING DISRUPTION TO THEIR READING EXPERIENCE.

PLACEMENT RELATIVE TO TEXTUAL DISCUSSION

THE CARDINAL RULE FOR FIGURE PLACEMENT IS PROXIMITY TO THEIR INITIAL MENTION IN THE TEXT. AFTER YOU HAVE DISCUSSED A FIGURE AND ITS SIGNIFICANCE, IT SHOULD BE PRESENTED. AVOID PLACING FIGURES AT THE VERY END OF A CHAPTER OR SECTION UNLESS ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY DUE TO SPACE CONSTRAINTS OR SPECIFIC LAYOUT REQUIREMENTS. WHEN A FIGURE MUST APPEAR ON A SUBSEQUENT PAGE, ENSURE A CLEAR TEXTUAL REFERENCE LEADING THE READER TO IT.

THE LIST OF FIGURES

EVERY THESIS THAT INCLUDES FIGURES MUST ALSO INCLUDE A LIST OF FIGURES. THIS IS A SEPARATE PAGE, USUALLY PLACED AFTER THE TABLE OF CONTENTS AND BEFORE THE MAIN BODY OF THE THESIS. THE LIST OF FIGURES PROVIDES A COMPREHENSIVE ENUMERATION OF ALL FIGURES WITHIN THE DOCUMENT, ALONG WITH THEIR CORRESPONDING TITLES AND THE PAGE NUMBERS ON WHICH THEY APPEAR. THIS SERVES AS A NAVIGATIONAL TOOL FOR READERS WHO WISH TO FIND SPECIFIC VISUAL ELEMENTS QUICKLY.

THE FORMAT FOR THE LIST OF FIGURES TYPICALLY MIRRORS THE CAPTION STYLE USED FOR INDIVIDUAL FIGURES. EACH ENTRY SHOULD INCLUDE THE FIGURE NUMBER (E.G., "FIGURE 1."), THE FIGURE TITLE, AND THE PAGE NUMBER. THE PAGE NUMBERS SHOULD BE RIGHT-ALIGNED FOR CLARITY. THE CONSTRUCTION OF THIS LIST IS OFTEN AUTOMATED BY WORD PROCESSING SOFTWARE, BUT CAREFUL PROOFREADING IS STILL ESSENTIAL TO CATCH ANY DISCREPANCIES.

BEST PRACTICES AND AVOIDING COMMON ERRORS

TO ENSURE YOUR THESIS IS BOTH COMPLIANT WITH CHICAGO STYLE AND EFFECTIVELY COMMUNICATES YOUR RESEARCH, ADOPTING BEST PRACTICES AND BEING AWARE OF COMMON ERRORS IS CRUCIAL. PROACTIVE ATTENTION TO THESE DETAILS CAN SAVE SIGNIFICANT REVISION TIME.

ONE OF THE MOST COMMON ERRORS IS INCONSISTENCY IN NUMBERING OR FORMATTING. WHETHER YOU CHOOSE CONSECUTIVE OR CHAPTER-BASED NUMBERING, MAINTAIN THAT SYSTEM STRICTLY THROUGHOUT THE ENTIRE THESIS. SIMILARLY, ENSURE THAT CAPTION FORMATTING, FONT CHOICES, AND PLACEMENT OF FIGURE NUMBERS ARE UNIFORM ACROSS ALL FIGURES.

MAINTAINING CONSISTENCY IN NUMBERING AND FORMATTING

THE BEDROCK OF GOOD PRACTICE IN FIGURE MANAGEMENT IS UNWAVERING CONSISTENCY. IF YOU DECIDE ON CONSECUTIVE NUMBERING, DO NOT INTRODUCE CHAPTER-BASED NUMBERING FOR A FEW FIGURES. IF YOU CHOOSE TO BOLD YOUR FIGURE NUMBERS, DO THIS FOR ALL OF THEM. THIS UNIFORMITY NOT ONLY ADHERES TO ACADEMIC STANDARDS BUT ALSO DEMONSTRATES A METICULOUS APPROACH TO YOUR WORK, INSTILLING CONFIDENCE IN YOUR READERS.

PROOFREADING FOR ERRORS

BEFORE SUBMITTING YOUR THESIS, A THOROUGH PROOFREADING PROCESS IS INDISPENSABLE. PAY SPECIAL ATTENTION TO YOUR FIGURES AND THEIR REFERENCES. CHECK THAT EVERY FIGURE NUMBER IN THE TEXT CORRESPONDS TO AN ACTUAL FIGURE AND THAT THE FIGURE NUMBER IN THE LIST OF FIGURES ACCURATELY MATCHES THE FIGURE ITSELF. VERIFY THAT PAGE NUMBERS IN THE LIST OF FIGURES ARE CORRECT. ENSURE THAT ALL CAPTIONS ARE CLEAR, GRAMMATICALLY CORRECT, AND FREE OF TYPOS. A FINAL READ-THROUGH SPECIFICALLY FOR FIGURE ACCURACY CAN PREVENT EASILY AVOIDABLE MISTAKES.

CONSULTING INSTITUTIONAL GUIDELINES

WHILE THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE PROVIDES A ROBUST FRAMEWORK, YOUR ACADEMIC INSTITUTION MAY HAVE SPECIFIC ADDENDUMS OR MODIFICATIONS TO THESE GUIDELINES, ESPECIALLY FOR THESES AND DISSERTATIONS. ALWAYS PRIORITIZE YOUR UNIVERSITY'S GRADUATE SCHOOL OR DEPARTMENTAL HANDBOOK ON THESIS FORMATTING. THESE INSTITUTIONAL GUIDELINES OFTEN SUPERSEDE OR CLARIFY CMOS. IF THERE'S ANY AMBIGUITY, SEEK CLARIFICATION FROM YOUR THESIS ADVISOR OR THE GRADUATE STUDIES OFFICE.

FAQ

Q: WHAT IS THE STANDARD CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE APPROACH TO NUMBERING FIGURES IN A THESIS?

A: THE STANDARD APPROACH RECOMMENDED BY THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE FOR THESES IS TO NUMBER FIGURES CONSECUTIVELY THROUGHOUT THE ENTIRE DOCUMENT. THIS MEANS THE FIRST FIGURE IS "FIGURE 1," THE SECOND IS "FIGURE 2," AND SO FORTH, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE CHAPTER IN WHICH THEY APPEAR.

Q: CAN FIGURES BE NUMBERED BY CHAPTER IN A THESIS ACCORDING TO CHICAGO STYLE?

A: WHILE THE MOST COMMON CHICAGO STYLE METHOD IS CONSECUTIVE NUMBERING, CHAPTER-BASED NUMBERING (E.G., FIGURE 1.1, FIGURE 1.2) IS SOMETIMES PERMITTED OR EVEN PREFERRED BY SPECIFIC ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS. IT IS CRUCIAL TO CONSULT YOUR UNIVERSITY'S SPECIFIC GUIDELINES TO DETERMINE WHICH NUMBERING SYSTEM IS ACCEPTABLE.

Q: WHERE SHOULD THE FIGURE NUMBER AND CAPTION BE PLACED IN A THESIS FOLLOWING CHICAGO STYLE?

A: GENERALLY, THE FIGURE NUMBER AND ITS CAPTION SHOULD BE PLACED DIRECTLY ABOVE THE FIGURE. HOWEVER, CMOS ALLOWS FOR FLEXIBILITY, AND CAPTIONS CAN ALSO BE PLACED BELOW THE FIGURE, PARTICULARLY IF THE FIGURE ITSELF IS VERY LARGE OR COMPLEX. CONSISTENCY THROUGHOUT THE THESIS IS THE KEY PRINCIPLE.

Q: WHAT INFORMATION MUST BE INCLUDED IN A FIGURE CAPTION ACCORDING TO CHICAGO STYLE?

A: A FIGURE CAPTION IN CHICAGO STYLE MUST INCLUDE THE FIGURE NUMBER (E.G., "FIGURE 1.") FOLLOWED BY A CLEAR AND DESCRIPTIVE TITLE THAT EXPLAINS THE CONTENT OF THE FIGURE. ADDITIONAL EXPLANATORY TEXT CAN BE ADDED TO PROVIDE CONTEXT OR DEFINE TERMS.

Q: HOW SHOULD I REFER TO FIGURES WITHIN THE TEXT OF MY THESIS WHEN USING CHICAGO STYLE?

A: WHEN REFERRING TO A FIGURE IN THE TEXT, USE ITS NUMBER. FOR EXAMPLE, YOU WOULD WRITE, "AS ILLUSTRATED IN FIGURE 3, THE DATA SHOWS A SIGNIFICANT TREND," OR "THIS OBSERVATION IS SUPPORTED BY THE RESULTS PRESENTED IN FIGURE 7A."

Q: WHAT IS A "LIST OF FIGURES" AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT FOR A THESIS USING CHICAGO STYLE?

A: A LIST OF FIGURES IS A SEPARATE PAGE, USUALLY FOUND AFTER THE TABLE OF CONTENTS, THAT ENUMERATES ALL FIGURES WITHIN THE THESIS. IT INCLUDES THE FIGURE NUMBER, ITS TITLE, AND THE PAGE NUMBER WHERE IT CAN BE FOUND. THIS SERVES AS A NAVIGATIONAL AID FOR READERS.

Q: SHOULD I USE ABBREVIATIONS FOR FIGURE NUMBERS IN MY THESIS?

A: THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE GENERALLY PREFERS THAT YOU SPELL OUT "FIGURE" IN THE TEXT OF YOUR THESIS. ABBREVIATIONS ARE TYPICALLY RESERVED FOR TABLES OR LISTS WHERE SPACE IS EXTREMELY LIMITED, BUT FOR STANDARD THESIS TEXT, THE FULL WORD IS RECOMMENDED.

Q: WHAT ARE COMMON ERRORS TO AVOID WHEN NUMBERING FIGURES IN A THESIS UNDER CHICAGO STYLE?

A: COMMON ERRORS INCLUDE INCONSISTENT NUMBERING SYSTEMS, INCONSISTENT CAPTION FORMATTING, INCORRECT PAGE NUMBERS IN THE LIST OF FIGURES, AND REFERRING TO FIGURES IN THE TEXT WITHOUT THEIR CORRECT NUMBER. CAREFUL PROOFREADING IS ESSENTIAL TO PREVENT THESE MISTAKES.

Q: DO I NEED TO NUMBER FIGURES DIFFERENTLY IF THEY ARE PART OF A LARGER COMPOSITE ILLUSTRATION?

A: YES, IF A SINGLE FIGURE CONSISTS OF MULTIPLE PARTS OR PANELS, YOU CAN USE LETTERS (A, B, C, ETC.) IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MAIN FIGURE NUMBER, SUCH AS "FIGURE 4A," "FIGURE 4B," ETC. A MAIN CAPTION WOULD DESCRIBE THE OVERALL FIGURE, AND SUB-CAPTIONS MIGHT BE USED FOR INDIVIDUAL PARTS IF NEEDED.

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
