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UNDERSTANDING CHICAGO STYLE: NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY VS. AUTHOR-DATE

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE OFFERS TWO PRIMARY SYSTEMS FOR CITING SOURCES: THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM AND THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM. UNDERSTANDING THE DISTINCTION AND KNOWING WHICH SYSTEM YOUR INSTRUCTOR OR PUBLISHER REQUIRES IS THE FOUNDATIONAL STEP IN PRODUCING A CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY. THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, OFTEN FAVORED IN THE HUMANITIES LIKE LITERATURE AND HISTORY, USES NUMBERED FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES FOR CITATIONS AND CONCLUDES WITH A BIBLIOGRAPHY THAT LISTS ALL SOURCES CONSULTED. THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, MORE PREVALENT IN THE SOCIAL SCIENCES, USES PARENTHETICAL IN-TEXT CITATIONS CONSISTING OF THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE PUBLICATION YEAR, FOLLOWED BY A REFERENCE LIST AT THE END OF THE PAPER.

THE CHOICE BETWEEN THESE TWO SYSTEMS IS USUALLY DICTATED BY THE SPECIFIC ACADEMIC DISCIPLINE OR PUBLICATION. FOR INSTANCE, A HISTORY PAPER WILL ALMOST INVARIABLY CALL FOR THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY FORMAT, ALLOWING FOR EXTENSIVE COMMENTARY AND CLARIFICATION WITHIN THE NOTES THEMSELVES. CONVERSELY, A SOCIOLOGY PAPER MIGHT OPT FOR THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, WHICH PRIORITIZES CONCISENESS IN THE MAIN TEXT, MAKING IT EASIER FOR READERS TO QUICKLY IDENTIFY THE SOURCE OF INFORMATION. FAMILIARIZING YOURSELF WITH THE PREFERRED SYSTEM FOR YOUR FIELD IS PARAMOUNT TO CORRECTLY APPLYING CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY TIPS.

THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM EXPLAINED

IN THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, EACH PIECE OF BORROWED INFORMATION, WHETHER A DIRECT QUOTE, PARAPHRASE, OR SUMMARY OF AN IDEA, IS ACCOMPANIED BY A SUPERScript ARABIC NUMERAL IN THE TEXT. THIS NUMERAL CORRESPONDS TO A FOOTNOTE AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PAGE OR AN ENDNOTE AT THE END OF THE DOCUMENT. THESE NOTES PROVIDE THE FULL CITATION DETAILS THE FIRST TIME A SOURCE IS REFERENCED. SUBSEQUENT REFERENCES TO THE SAME SOURCE ARE TYPICALLY SHORTENED, OFTEN USING "IBID." FOR IMMEDIATE REPETITION OR THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND A SHORTENED TITLE FOR LATER MENTIONS. THE BIBLIOGRAPHY, APPEARING AT THE END, LISTS ALL SOURCES ALPHABETICALLY BY AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, PROVIDING COMPLETE PUBLICATION INFORMATION FOR EACH ENTRY.

THIS SYSTEM OFFERS A DISTINCT ADVANTAGE FOR SCHOLARS WHO WISH TO INCLUDE EXPLANATORY NOTES OR ENGAGE IN

EXTENDED DISCUSSIONS TANGENTIAL TO THE MAIN TEXT WITHOUT DISRUPTING THE FLOW OF THE ESSAY. THE DETAILED CITATIONS IN THE NOTES ALSO PROVIDE A CLEAR TRAIL FOR READERS TO LOCATE THE ORIGINAL SOURCES. PRACTICING THE CORRECT NUMBERING AND FORMAT FOR BOTH FOOTNOTES/ENDNOTES AND THE BIBLIOGRAPHY IS A KEY ASPECT OF MASTERING THESE CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY TIPS.

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM EXPLAINED

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM OF CHICAGO STYLE IS MORE STREAMLINED WITHIN THE BODY OF THE ESSAY. INSTEAD OF SUPERSCRIT NUMBERS, CITATIONS APPEAR AS PARENTHETICAL INCLUSIONS WITHIN THE TEXT, TYPICALLY FORMATTED AS (AUTHOR LAST NAME YEAR, PAGE NUMBER). FOR EXAMPLE, A CITATION MIGHT LOOK LIKE (SMITH 2020, 45). IF THE AUTHOR'S NAME IS MENTIONED IN THE SENTENCE, ONLY THE YEAR AND PAGE NUMBER ARE NEEDED IN PARENTHESES, SUCH AS "SMITH ARGUES THAT THE ECONOMY IS IN DECLINE (2020, 45)." THIS SYSTEM PRIORITIZES DIRECT ATTRIBUTION OF IDEAS TO THEIR SOURCES IN THE IMMEDIATE CONTEXT OF THE WRITING.

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM REQUIRES A CORRESPONDING REFERENCE LIST AT THE END OF THE PAPER, ALPHABETIZED BY AUTHOR'S LAST NAME. THIS LIST INCLUDES FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC DETAILS FOR ALL WORKS CITED IN THE TEXT. THE REFERENCE LIST ENTRIES ARE GENERALLY MORE CONCISE THAN THOSE IN A BIBLIOGRAPHY FOR THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM. THIS METHOD IS OFTEN PREFERRED IN FIELDS WHERE RAPID VERIFICATION OF SOURCES IS IMPORTANT AND WHERE LENGTHY FOOTNOTES MIGHT INTERRUPT THE ANALYTICAL FLOW OF THE ARGUMENT.

MASTERING IN-TEXT CITATIONS IN CHICAGO STYLE

ACCURATE IN-TEXT CITATIONS ARE THE BACKBONE OF ANY ACADEMIC PAPER, AND CHICAGO STYLE, WITH ITS TWO DISTINCT SYSTEMS, REQUIRES CAREFUL ATTENTION TO DETAIL. WHETHER EMPLOYING THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM OR THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THE GOAL IS TO GIVE CREDIT TO ORIGINAL SOURCES AND ALLOW READERS TO LOCATE THEM. PROPER CITATION PREVENTS PLAGIARISM AND LENDS CREDIBILITY TO YOUR RESEARCH AND ARGUMENTS, MAKING IT A CRITICAL COMPONENT OF CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY TIPS.

IN-TEXT CITATIONS FOR NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY

WHEN USING THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, IN-TEXT CITATIONS ARE MANAGED THROUGH SUPERSCRIT NUMBERS. EACH TIME YOU INTRODUCE INFORMATION FROM A SOURCE, YOU ADD A NUMBER THAT INCREMENTS SEQUENTIALLY THROUGHOUT THE PAPER. THE FIRST TIME A SOURCE IS CITED, THE CORRESPONDING FOOTNOTE OR ENDNOTE WILL CONTAIN ITS COMPLETE BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION. FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU QUOTE A BOOK, THE FIRST NOTE MIGHT READ: 1. JOHN SMITH, *THE HISTORY OF IDEAS* (CHICAGO: UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO PRESS, 2020), 78.

SUBSEQUENT CITATIONS OF THE SAME SOURCE ARE ABBREVIATED. IF THE IMMEDIATE PRECEDING NOTE REFERS TO THE SAME SOURCE, YOU WOULD USE "IBID." IF IT'S A DIFFERENT SOURCE, OR IF THERE ARE OTHER NOTES IN BETWEEN, YOU USE A SHORTENED FORM. THIS TYPICALLY INCLUDES THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, A SHORTENED TITLE OF THE WORK, AND THE PAGE NUMBER. FOR INSTANCE: 2. SMITH, *HISTORY OF IDEAS*, 92. THIS METHOD OF CITATION ENSURES THAT THE READER CAN EASILY TRACE THE ORIGIN OF EVERY PIECE OF INFORMATION WITHOUT CONSTANT INTERRUPTION OF THE MAIN TEXT, A KEY ASPECT OF CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY TIPS.

IN-TEXT CITATIONS FOR AUTHOR-DATE

IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, IN-TEXT CITATIONS ARE INTEGRATED DIRECTLY INTO THE NARRATIVE OF YOUR ESSAY. AS MENTIONED, THESE CITATIONS TYPICALLY INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION, ENCLOSED IN PARENTHESES. IF YOU ARE REFERENCING A SPECIFIC PASSAGE, YOU ALSO INCLUDE THE PAGE NUMBER. FOR EXAMPLE, A CITATION

MIGHT APPEAR AS: (SMITH 2020, 78). IF THE AUTHOR'S NAME IS PART OF YOUR SENTENCE, YOU ONLY NEED THE YEAR AND PAGE NUMBER IN PARENTHESES: SMITH'S SEMINAL WORK DISCUSSES THE EVOLUTION OF THOUGHT (2020, 78).

IT IS CRUCIAL TO ENSURE THAT EVERY IN-TEXT CITATION CORRESPONDS TO AN ENTRY IN YOUR REFERENCE LIST AND VICE VERSA. CONSISTENCY IS KEY. IF A SOURCE HAS MULTIPLE AUTHORS, CHICAGO STYLE HAS SPECIFIC RULES FOR HOW TO CITE THEM DEPENDING ON THE NUMBER OF AUTHORS INVOLVED. FOR WORKS WITH THREE OR MORE AUTHORS, YOU TYPICALLY LIST THE FIRST AUTHOR FOLLOWED BY "ET AL." IN THE IN-TEXT CITATION. FAMILIARITY WITH THESE RULES IS ESSENTIAL FOR ACCURATE AND EFFECTIVE CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY TIPS IMPLEMENTATION.

CRAFTING YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY OR REFERENCE LIST

THE BIBLIOGRAPHY OR REFERENCE LIST IS A CRITICAL COMPONENT OF YOUR CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY, PROVIDING A COMPLETE RECORD OF ALL THE SOURCES YOU HAVE CONSULTED AND CITED. ITS PRIMARY PURPOSE IS TO ALLOW YOUR READERS TO FIND THE ORIGINAL MATERIALS YOURSELF. THE SPECIFIC FORMAT AND CONTENT OF THIS LIST WILL VARY DEPENDING ON WHETHER YOU ARE USING THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM OR THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, BUT THE CORE PRINCIPLE OF PROVIDING COMPLETE AND ACCURATE BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION REMAINS THE SAME. THIS IS A NON-NEGOTIABLE ELEMENT OF CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY TIPS.

THE BIBLIOGRAPHY IN NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM

A BIBLIOGRAPHY COMPILED FOR THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM IS AN ALPHABETICAL LIST OF ALL SOURCES CITED IN YOUR FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES, AS WELL AS ANY OTHER SOURCES YOU CONSULTED FOR YOUR RESEARCH EVEN IF NOT DIRECTLY CITED. ENTRIES ARE TYPICALLY ALPHABETIZED BY THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME. EACH ENTRY PROVIDES FULL PUBLICATION DETAILS, INCLUDING THE AUTHOR'S FULL NAME, THE TITLE OF THE WORK (ITALICIZED FOR BOOKS AND JOURNALS, IN QUOTATION MARKS FOR ARTICLES), THE PLACE OF PUBLICATION, THE PUBLISHER, AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. FOR JOURNAL ARTICLES, YOU WOULD ALSO INCLUDE THE JOURNAL TITLE, VOLUME, ISSUE NUMBER, AND PAGE RANGE.

THE FORMATTING OF BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRIES IS SPECIFIC. FOR EXAMPLE, A BOOK ENTRY MIGHT LOOK LIKE: LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. TITLE OF BOOK. CITY OF PUBLICATION: PUBLISHER, YEAR. AN ARTICLE IN A JOURNAL WOULD APPEAR AS: LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. "TITLE OF ARTICLE." TITLE OF JOURNAL VOLUME, no. ISSUE (YEAR): PAGE NUMBERS. ADHERING TO THESE PRECISE FORMATTING GUIDELINES IS VITAL FOR PRODUCING A PROFESSIONAL CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY.

THE REFERENCE LIST IN AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM

THE REFERENCE LIST USED WITH THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IS SIMILAR IN PURPOSE TO A BIBLIOGRAPHY BUT DIFFERS IN ITS SCOPE AND SOMETIMES IN ITS FORMATTING. GENERALLY, THE REFERENCE LIST INCLUDES ONLY THOSE SOURCES THAT HAVE BEEN CITED IN THE TEXT. LIKE THE BIBLIOGRAPHY, IT IS ARRANGED ALPHABETICALLY BY AUTHOR'S LAST NAME. THE ENTRIES ARE DESIGNED TO BE CONCISE AND INFORMATIVE, MIRRORING THE IN-TEXT CITATIONS.

A TYPICAL REFERENCE LIST ENTRY FOR A BOOK WOULD BE: LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. YEAR. TITLE OF BOOK. CITY OF PUBLICATION: PUBLISHER. FOR AN ARTICLE: LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. YEAR. "TITLE OF ARTICLE." TITLE OF JOURNAL VOLUME (ISSUE): PAGE NUMBERS. THE KEY DIFFERENCE IS THE INCLUSION OF THE PUBLICATION YEAR IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE AUTHOR'S NAME. ENSURING THAT EVERY SOURCE CITED IN THE TEXT HAS A CORRESPONDING ENTRY IN THE REFERENCE LIST, AND VICE VERSA, IS FUNDAMENTAL TO SUCCESSFUL CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY TIPS APPLICATION.

FORMATTING YOUR CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY

BEYOND CITATION, THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE OUTLINES SPECIFIC FORMATTING GUIDELINES THAT APPLY TO THE OVERALL PRESENTATION OF YOUR ESSAY. THESE CONVENTIONS ENSURE CONSISTENCY AND READABILITY ACROSS ACADEMIC WORKS. ADHERING TO THESE STRUCTURAL AND PRESENTATIONAL RULES IS AS IMPORTANT AS CORRECT CITATION FOR PRODUCING A POLISHED CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY. THESE ELEMENTS CONTRIBUTE TO THE PROFESSIONAL APPEARANCE AND SCHOLARLY INTEGRITY OF YOUR WORK.

GENERAL FORMATTING REQUIREMENTS

CHICAGO STYLE ESSAYS TYPICALLY REQUIRE DOUBLE-SPACING THROUGHOUT THE ENTIRE DOCUMENT, INCLUDING BLOCK QUOTES AND THE BIBLIOGRAPHY OR REFERENCE LIST. THE PAPER SHOULD BE PRINTED ON STANDARD-SIZED PAPER (8.5 x 11 INCHES). MARGINS SHOULD GENERALLY BE SET AT 1 INCH ON ALL SIDES. THE FONT SHOULD BE A STANDARD, LEGIBLE TYPEFACE, SUCH AS TIMES NEW ROMAN OR ARIAL, IN 12-POINT SIZE.

A TITLE PAGE IS OFTEN REQUIRED, THOUGH SOME INSTRUCTORS MAY OPT FOR A SIMPLER FIRST PAGE WITH JUST THE TITLE, YOUR NAME, THE COURSE NAME, AND THE DATE. IF A TITLE PAGE IS USED, IT TYPICALLY INCLUDES THE ESSAY TITLE, YOUR NAME, THE INSTRUCTOR'S NAME, THE COURSE NAME, AND THE DATE. NO PAGE NUMBERS ARE USUALLY INCLUDED ON THE TITLE PAGE. PAGE NUMBERS FOR THE REST OF THE DOCUMENT ARE TYPICALLY PLACED IN THE UPPER RIGHT-HAND CORNER, STARTING FROM THE FIRST PAGE OF THE MAIN TEXT.

FORMATTING SPECIFIC ELEMENTS

BLOCK QUOTES, WHICH ARE GENERALLY USED FOR QUOTATIONS OF FIVE OR MORE LINES, SHOULD BE INDENTED FROM THE LEFT MARGIN WITHOUT QUOTATION MARKS. THE CITATION FOR A BLOCK QUOTE FOLLOWS THE SAME PRINCIPLES AS IN-TEXT CITATIONS, BUT THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION OR NOTE NUMBER APPEARS AFTER THE PUNCTUATION OF THE QUOTE.

TABLES AND FIGURES SHOULD BE CLEARLY LABELED WITH NUMBERS AND DESCRIPTIVE TITLES. THEY SHOULD BE PLACED AS CLOSE AS POSSIBLE TO THEIR FIRST MENTION IN THE TEXT. IF A TABLE OR FIGURE IS FROM A SOURCE OTHER THAN YOUR OWN, IT REQUIRES A CITATION. UNDERSTANDING THESE SPECIFIC FORMATTING ELEMENTS IS CRUCIAL FOR PRESENTING YOUR CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY IN A PROFESSIONAL AND COMPLIANT MANNER.

COMMON PITFALLS AND HOW TO AVOID THEM

NAVIGATING THE INTRICACIES OF CHICAGO STYLE CAN BE CHALLENGING, AND SEVERAL COMMON PITFALLS CAN DETRACT FROM THE QUALITY OF YOUR ESSAY. CITATION ERRORS

ONE OF THE MOST FREQUENT ERRORS IS INCONSISTENT CITATION. THIS CAN MANIFEST AS VARIATIONS IN FORMATTING FOR THE SAME TYPE OF SOURCE, MISSING ESSENTIAL INFORMATION IN NOTES OR THE BIBLIOGRAPHY, OR INCORRECT NUMBERING OF NOTES. ANOTHER COMMON MISTAKE IS FAILING TO CITE ALL SOURCES PROPERLY, LEADING TO UNINTENTIONAL PLAGIARISM. OVER-RELIANCE ON "IBID." WITHOUT UNDERSTANDING WHEN IT'S APPROPRIATE CAN ALSO CAUSE CONFUSION. TO AVOID THESE, ALWAYS REFER TO A RELIABLE STYLE GUIDE AND DOUBLE-CHECK EVERY CITATION AGAINST YOUR NOTES OR REFERENCE LIST.

FORMATTING INCONSISTENCIES

INCONSISTENCIES IN GENERAL FORMATTING, SUCH AS INCORRECT SPACING, FONT CHOICES, OR MARGIN SETTINGS, CAN ALSO BE PROBLEMATIC. FOR EXAMPLE, FORGETTING TO DOUBLE-SPACE BLOCK QUOTES OR USING QUOTATION MARKS FOR THEM ARE FREQUENT ERRORS. ENSURING THAT YOUR PAGE NUMBERING IS CONSISTENT AND THAT EVERY PAGE IS ACCOUNTED FOR IS ALSO IMPORTANT. REGULARLY REVIEW YOUR PAPER AGAINST THE REQUIREMENTS OF CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY TIPS TO CATCH THESE FORMATTING OVERSIGHTS BEFORE SUBMISSION.

MISUNDERSTANDING SOURCE TYPES

DIFFERENT TYPES OF SOURCES—BOOKS, JOURNAL ARTICLES, WEBSITES, INTERVIEWS, ETC.—REQUIRE SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT CITATION FORMATS. A COMMON PITFALL IS APPLYING THE FORMAT FOR ONE SOURCE TYPE TO ANOTHER. FOR INSTANCE, TREATING A WEBSITE LIKE A BOOK OR AN ARTICLE LIKE A CHAPTER IN AN EDITED COLLECTION. CONSULT YOUR STYLE GUIDE FOR THE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH TYPE OF SOURCE YOU USE. DILIGENT PRACTICE AND A METHODICAL APPROACH TO SOURCE MANAGEMENT WILL HELP YOU MASTER THESE NUANCES.

ESSENTIAL RESOURCES FOR CHICAGO STYLE

SUCCESSFULLY IMPLEMENTING CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY TIPS RELIES HEAVILY ON ACCESS TO ACCURATE AND COMPREHENSIVE RESOURCES. HAVING THESE TOOLS AT YOUR DISPOSAL WILL ENSURE YOUR ACADEMIC WORK IS CONSISTENTLY POLISHED AND COMPLIANT WITH THE LATEST STANDARDS.

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE

THE PRIMARY AND MOST AUTHORITATIVE RESOURCE IS, OF COURSE, THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE. FAQ

Q: WHAT IS THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM AND THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE LIES IN HOW SOURCES ARE CITED WITHIN THE TEXT AND PRESENTED AT THE END. THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM USES NUMBERED FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES FOR IN-TEXT CITATIONS AND CONCLUDES WITH A COMPREHENSIVE BIBLIOGRAPHY LISTING ALL SOURCES. THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM USES PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS IN THE TEXT

(AUTHOR YEAR, PAGE) AND CONCLUDES WITH A REFERENCE LIST THAT INCLUDES ONLY CITED SOURCES.

Q: HOW DO I FORMAT A BLOCK QUOTE IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: A BLOCK QUOTE IN CHICAGO STYLE IS TYPICALLY USED FOR QUOTATIONS OF FIVE OR MORE LINES. IT SHOULD BE INDENTED FROM THE LEFT MARGIN, SINGLE-SPACED, AND NOT ENCLOSED IN QUOTATION MARKS. THE CITATION (A FOOTNOTE/ENDNOTE NUMBER OR AUTHOR-DATE PARENTHETICAL) FOLLOWS THE PUNCTUATION AT THE END OF THE QUOTE.

Q: WHEN SHOULD I USE "IBID." IN MY CHICAGO STYLE NOTES?

A: "IBID." IS USED IN THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM TO REFER TO THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING SOURCE CITED. IT IS USUALLY FOLLOWED BY A PAGE NUMBER IF YOU ARE REFERRING TO A DIFFERENT PAGE IN THAT SAME SOURCE. IF IT IS THE EXACT SAME SOURCE AND PAGE, JUST "IBID." IS SUFFICIENT.

Q: DO I NEED TO INCLUDE UNCITED SOURCES IN MY BIBLIOGRAPHY?

A: IF YOU ARE USING THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THE BIBLIOGRAPHY SHOULD INCLUDE ALL SOURCES CITED IN YOUR NOTES, AS WELL AS ANY OTHER SOURCES YOU CONSULTED FOR YOUR RESEARCH, EVEN IF THEY WERE NOT DIRECTLY QUOTED OR PARAPHRASED. IF YOU ARE USING THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THE REFERENCE LIST GENERALLY INCLUDES ONLY THOSE SOURCES CITED WITHIN THE TEXT.

Q: WHAT FONT AND SPACING ARE RECOMMENDED FOR A CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY?

A: CHICAGO STYLE GENERALLY RECOMMENDS A STANDARD, LEGIBLE FONT LIKE TIMES NEW ROMAN OR ARIAL IN 12-POINT SIZE. THE ENTIRE DOCUMENT, INCLUDING BLOCK QUOTES AND THE BIBLIOGRAPHY/REFERENCE LIST, SHOULD BE DOUBLE-SPACED.

Q: HOW DO I CITE A WEBSITE IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: CITING A WEBSITE IN CHICAGO STYLE INVOLVES PROVIDING THE AUTHOR (IF AVAILABLE), THE TITLE OF THE SPECIFIC PAGE OR ARTICLE, THE TITLE OF THE WEBSITE, THE PUBLICATION DATE (IF AVAILABLE), AND THE URL. FOR THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THE FULL CITATION GOES IN THE NOTE, AND A SHORTENED VERSION OR THE FULL CITATION MAY APPEAR IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY. FOR THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THE CITATION INCLUDES AUTHOR AND DATE IN-TEXT, WITH A FULL ENTRY IN THE REFERENCE LIST.

Q: WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A BIBLIOGRAPHY AND A REFERENCE LIST IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: WHILE BOTH LIST SOURCES, A BIBLIOGRAPHY IN THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM TYPICALLY INCLUDES ALL CONSULTED SOURCES, CITED OR NOT, WHILE A REFERENCE LIST IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM USUALLY CONTAINS ONLY THE SOURCES DIRECTLY CITED IN THE TEXT. THE FORMATTING OF ENTRIES CAN ALSO DIFFER SLIGHTLY BETWEEN THE TWO.

Q: HOW SHOULD I HANDLE CITATIONS FOR SOURCES WITH MULTIPLE AUTHORS IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: FOR TWO AUTHORS, LIST BOTH NAMES IN THE CITATION. FOR THREE OR MORE AUTHORS, IN THE NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, LIST ALL AUTHORS IN THE FIRST NOTE, AND SUBSEQUENT NOTES USE THE FIRST AUTHOR'S NAME FOLLOWED BY "ET AL." IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, YOU GENERALLY LIST ALL AUTHORS IN THE REFERENCE LIST, BUT USE THE FIRST AUTHOR'S NAME FOLLOWED BY "ET AL." IN IN-TEXT CITATIONS FOR THREE OR MORE AUTHORS.

Q: Do I NEED A TITLE PAGE FOR A CHICAGO STYLE ESSAY?

A: THE REQUIREMENT FOR A TITLE PAGE CAN VARY. MANY INSTRUCTORS PREFER A TITLE PAGE THAT INCLUDES THE ESSAY TITLE, YOUR NAME, THE COURSE NAME, AND THE DATE. HOWEVER, SOME MAY OPT FOR A SIMPLER FIRST PAGE WITH JUST THE ESSENTIAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION. ALWAYS CHECK YOUR SPECIFIC ASSIGNMENT GUIDELINES.

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
