MASTERING THE CHICAGO STYLE IN-TEXT CITATION FORMAT: A COMPREHENSIVE GUIDE

CHICAGO STYLE IN-TEXT CITATION FORMAT IS A CRITICAL COMPONENT OF ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL WRITING, ENSURING PROPER ATTRIBUTION AND PREVENTING PLAGIARISM. THIS WIDELY ADOPTED STYLE, PARTICULARLY PREVALENT IN HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES, REQUIRES METICULOUS ATTENTION TO DETAIL FOR BOTH PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS AND FOOTNOTES/ENDNOTES. UNDERSTANDING ITS NUANCES IS KEY TO PRESENTING CREDIBLE RESEARCH AND ACKNOWLEDGING THE INTELLECTUAL CONTRIBUTIONS OF OTHERS. THIS GUIDE WILL DELVE DEEPLY INTO THE CORE PRINCIPLES OF CHICAGO STYLE IN-TEXT CITATIONS, COVERING AUTHOR-DATE AND NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEMS, VARIATIONS FOR DIFFERENT SOURCE TYPES, AND COMMON PITFALLS TO AVOID. WE WILL EXPLORE HOW TO INTEGRATE THESE CITATIONS SEAMLESSLY INTO YOUR WRITING, ENSURING CLARITY AND ADHERENCE TO SCHOLARLY STANDARDS.

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UNDERSTANDING THE TWO CHICAGO STYLE SYSTEMS

CHICAGO STYLE OFFERS TWO DISTINCT SYSTEMS FOR INCORPORATING CITATIONS INTO YOUR WORK: THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM AND THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM. WHILE BOTH AIM FOR ACCURATE ATTRIBUTION, THEY DIFFER IN THEIR PRESENTATION WITHIN THE TEXT. CHOOSING THE APPROPRIATE SYSTEM OFTEN DEPENDS ON THE SPECIFIC DISCIPLINE OR PUBLICATION GUIDELINES YOU ARE FOLLOWING. EACH SYSTEM HAS ITS OWN SET OF RULES AND CONVENTIONS FOR HOW INFORMATION IS CONVEYED.

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM: PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, OFTEN PREFERRED IN THE SCIENCES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES, USES BRIEF PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS DIRECTLY WITHIN THE TEXT. THESE CITATIONS TYPICALLY INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION, AND A PAGE NUMBER IF A SPECIFIC PASSAGE IS BEING REFERENCED. THIS METHOD ALLOWS READERS TO QUICKLY IDENTIFY THE SOURCE OF INFORMATION WITHOUT INTERRUPTING THE FLOW OF THE TEXT SIGNIFICANTLY.

THE CORE OF THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM INVOLVES PLACING THE CITATION AT THE END OF THE SENTENCE OR CLAUSE CONTAINING THE BORROWED INFORMATION. THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR ARE ESSENTIAL, FORMING THE PRIMARY LINK TO THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY IN A REFERENCE LIST AT THE END OF THE DOCUMENT. FOR DIRECT QUOTATIONS OR PARAPHRASED SPECIFIC IDEAS, INCLUDING THE PAGE NUMBER IS CRUCIAL FOR PINPOINTING THE EXACT LOCATION OF THE SOURCE MATERIAL.

THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM: FOOTNOTES AND ENDNOTES

THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, MORE COMMON IN THE HUMANITIES, UTILIZES NUMBERED FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES. EACH CITATION IS ASSIGNED A UNIQUE NUMBER THAT CORRESPONDS TO A MORE DETAILED NOTE AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PAGE (FOOTNOTE) OR AT THE END OF THE DOCUMENT (ENDNOTE). THIS SYSTEM CAN BE PARTICULARLY USEFUL FOR INCORPORATING LENGTHY EXPLANATIONS OR SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION WITHOUT CLUTTERING THE MAIN BODY OF THE TEXT.

WHEN USING THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THE FIRST CITATION FOR A PARTICULAR SOURCE IS TYPICALLY MORE

COMPREHENSIVE, INCLUDING FULL PUBLICATION DETAILS. SUBSEQUENT CITATIONS FOR THE SAME SOURCE ARE OFTEN SHORTENED, USUALLY TO THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, A SHORTENED TITLE, AND THE PAGE NUMBER. THE CORRESPONDING BIBLIOGRAPHY AT THE END OF THE PAPER PROVIDES COMPLETE INFORMATION FOR ALL CITED SOURCES.

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM: PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS

IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, CONCISENESS AND CLARITY ARE PARAMOUNT. THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION SERVES AS A DIRECT BRIDGE TO THE FULL REFERENCE. MASTERING ITS CONSTRUCTION IS VITAL FOR AVOIDING COMMON ERRORS AND MAINTAINING ACADEMIC INTEGRITY.

BASIC PARENTHETICAL STRUCTURE

THE MOST STRAIGHTFORWARD PARENTHETICAL CITATION INCLUDES THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. FOR INSTANCE, IF YOU ARE CITING A WORK BY JANE DOE PUBLISHED IN 2023, THE CITATION WOULD APPEAR AS (DOE 2023). THIS FORMAT IS EMPLOYED FOR GENERAL REFERENCES TO THE SOURCE'S IDEAS OR FINDINGS.

WHEN QUOTING DIRECTLY OR PARAPHRASING A SPECIFIC IDEA FROM A PARTICULAR PAGE OR RANGE OF PAGES, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE PAGE NUMBER. THIS IS FORMATTED AS (DOE 2023, 15). FOR A RANGE OF PAGES, IT WOULD BE (DOE 2023, 15–17). THIS LEVEL OF DETAIL IS ESSENTIAL FOR READERS WHO WISH TO CONSULT THE ORIGINAL TEXT.

CITING MULTIPLE AUTHORS

CITING WORKS WITH MULTIPLE AUTHORS FOLLOWS SPECIFIC RULES IN THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM. FOR TWO AUTHORS, BOTH LAST NAMES ARE INCLUDED, CONNECTED BY AN AMPERSAND: (SMITH AND JONES 2022).

FOR THREE OR MORE AUTHORS, ONLY THE FIRST AUTHOR'S LAST NAME IS USED, FOLLOWED BY "ET AL." AND THE YEAR. FOR EXAMPLE, IF A WORK HAS AUTHORS ADAMS, BROWN, AND CARTER, THE CITATION WOULD BE (ADAMS ET AL. 2021). THIS CONVENTION HELPS KEEP CITATIONS BRIEF WHEN DEALING WITH EXTENSIVELY AUTHORED WORKS.

CITING WORKS WITH NO AUTHOR

WHEN A WORK LACKS A SPECIFIC AUTHOR, THE CITATION TYPICALLY BEGINS WITH THE TITLE OF THE WORK, OFTEN SHORTENED IF IT IS LENGTHY. THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION FOLLOWS. FOR EXAMPLE, A BOOK TITLED "THE HISTORY OF MODERN ARCHITECTURE" MIGHT BE CITED AS ("HISTORY OF MODERN ARCHITECTURE" 2020).

IT IS IMPORTANT TO ITALICIZE THE TITLE WITHIN THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION IF IT REFERS TO A STANDALONE WORK LIKE A BOOK OR JOURNAL. IF IT'S AN ARTICLE OR CHAPTER, IT SHOULD BE ENCLOSED IN QUOTATION MARKS. THIS DISTINCTION ENSURES CLARITY REGARDING THE TYPE OF SOURCE BEING REFERENCED.

THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM: FOOTNOTES AND ENDNOTES

THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM OFFERS A DIFFERENT APPROACH TO IN-TEXT ATTRIBUTION, RELYING ON NUMBERED REFERENCES TO DETAILED NOTES. THIS SYSTEM ALLOWS FOR GREATER FLEXIBILITY IN PROVIDING CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION AND DETAILED SOURCE ATTRIBUTION.

FOOTNOTE AND ENDNOTE NUMBERING

EVERY TIME YOU INTRODUCE INFORMATION FROM A SOURCE THAT REQUIRES ATTRIBUTION, YOU WILL INSERT A SUPERScript ARABIC NUMERAL INTO YOUR TEXT. THIS NUMERAL CORRESPONDS TO A NOTE AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PAGE (FOOTNOTE) OR AT THE END OF THE CHAPTER OR DOCUMENT (ENDNOTE). THE NUMBERING SHOULD BE SEQUENTIAL THROUGHOUT THE DOCUMENT.

THE FIRST FOOTNOTE OR ENDNOTE FOR A GIVEN SOURCE SHOULD INCLUDE COMPLETE BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION. THIS TYPICALLY COMPRISES THE AUTHOR'S FULL NAME, THE TITLE OF THE WORK (ITALICIZED FOR BOOKS, IN QUOTATION MARKS FOR ARTICLES), PUBLICATION DETAILS (CITY, PUBLISHER, YEAR), AND THE SPECIFIC PAGE NUMBER(S) CITED.

SUBSEQUENT CITATIONS IN NOTES

AFTER THE INITIAL FULL NOTE, SUBSEQUENT CITATIONS FOR THE SAME SOURCE CAN BE SIGNIFICANTLY SHORTENED. THIS BREVITY AVOIDS REDUNDANCY AND MAKES THE NOTES EASIER TO READ. A COMMON FORMAT INCLUDES THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, A SHORTENED TITLE OF THE WORK, AND THE PAGE NUMBER.

FOR EXAMPLE, IF THE FIRST NOTE FOR A BOOK BY JOHN SMITH WAS "JOHN SMITH, *THE ART OF ARGUMENTATION* (NEW YORK: PENGUIN BOOKS, 2019), 45." SUBSEQUENT CITATIONS TO THIS WORK WOULD APPEAR AS "SMITH, *ART OF ARGUMENTATION*, 62." THIS SHORTENED FORM CLEARLY IDENTIFIES THE SOURCE WITHOUT REPEATING ALL PUBLICATION DETAILS.

USING "IBID."

THE LATIN ABBREVIATION "IBID." (MEANING "IN THE SAME PLACE") IS USED TO REFER TO THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING NOTE. IF THE CITATION REFERS TO THE SAME PAGE AS THE PRECEDING NOTE, SIMPLY USE "IBID."

IF THE CITATION REFERS TO A DIFFERENT PAGE WITHIN THE SAME SOURCE AS THE PRECEDING NOTE, YOU WOULD USE "IBID." FOLLOWED BY THE NEW PAGE NUMBER. FOR INSTANCE, IF THE PREVIOUS NOTE CITED PAGE 62 OF SMITH'S BOOK, AND YOU NOW NEED TO CITE PAGE 70, THE NOTE WOULD READ "IBID., 70." THIS FURTHER STREAMLINES THE CITATION PROCESS.

COMMON SOURCE TYPES AND THEIR CHICAGO IN-TEXT CITATION FORMATS

REGARDLESS OF WHETHER YOU ARE USING THE AUTHOR-DATE OR NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THE FUNDAMENTAL INFORMATION REQUIRED FOR CITING DIFFERENT TYPES OF SOURCES REMAINS CONSISTENT. HOWEVER, THE PRESENTATION WITHIN THE IN-TEXT CITATION WILL VARY.

Books

FOR BOOKS, THE AUTHOR'S NAME AND YEAR ARE CENTRAL TO THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM. FOR INSTANCE, A BOOK BY EMILY CARTER PUBLISHED IN 2023 WOULD BE CITED AS (CARTER 2023). IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THE FIRST NOTE WOULD INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S FULL NAME, TITLE, PUBLISHER, AND YEAR.

JOURNAL ARTICLES

WHEN CITING JOURNAL ARTICLES, THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND YEAR ARE USED IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM: (GREEN 2020). IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THE FIRST NOTE WOULD TYPICALLY INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S FULL NAME, ARTICLE TITLE, JOURNAL TITLE, VOLUME, ISSUE NUMBER, AND PUBLICATION YEAR, ALONG WITH THE PAGE NUMBER.

WEBSITES AND ONLINE SOURCES

CITING ONLINE SOURCES REQUIRES CAREFUL ATTENTION TO AVAILABLE INFORMATION. IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, IF AN AUTHOR IS LISTED, IT'S (AUTHOR LAST NAME YEAR). IF NO AUTHOR, USE A SHORTENED TITLE AND YEAR: ("ARTICLE TITLE" YEAR). FOR NOTES, INCLUDE THE AUTHOR (IF KNOWN), ARTICLE TITLE, WEBSITE NAME, DATE ACCESSED, AND URL.

OTHER SOURCE TYPES

CHICAGO STYLE ALSO PROVIDES GUIDELINES FOR CITING A WIDE ARRAY OF OTHER MATERIALS, INCLUDING BOOK CHAPTERS, DISSERTATIONS, INTERVIEWS, AND GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS. THE KEY PRINCIPLE ACROSS ALL THESE IS TO PROVIDE ENOUGH INFORMATION FOR THE READER TO LOCATE THE ORIGINAL SOURCE UNAMBIGUOUSLY. ALWAYS CONSULT THE LATEST EDITION OF THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE FOR THE MOST PRECISE AND UP-TO-DATE GUIDANCE ON LESS COMMON SOURCE TYPES.

BEST PRACTICES FOR CHICAGO STYLE IN-TEXT CITATIONS

ADHERING TO BEST PRACTICES ENSURES THAT YOUR CHICAGO STYLE IN-TEXT CITATIONS ARE NOT ONLY ACCURATE BUT ALSO ENHANCE THE CREDIBILITY AND READABILITY OF YOUR WORK. CONSISTENCY AND CLARITY ARE THE CORNERSTONES OF EFFECTIVE CITATION.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY

ONCE YOU HAVE CHOSEN EITHER THE AUTHOR-DATE OR NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, MAINTAIN THAT CHOICE THROUGHOUT YOUR ENTIRE DOCUMENT. SWITCHING BETWEEN SYSTEMS MID-DOCUMENT CAN CONFUSE READERS AND UNDERMINE THE PROFESSIONALISM OF YOUR WORK. SIMILARLY, BE CONSISTENT IN HOW YOU FORMAT ELEMENTS WITHIN YOUR CHOSEN SYSTEM.

CLARITY OVER CONCISENESS

WHILE BREVITY IS OFTEN A GOAL IN ACADEMIC WRITING, CLARITY SHOULD NEVER BE SACRIFICED FOR CONCISENESS. ENSURE THAT YOUR CITATIONS PROVIDE ALL THE NECESSARY INFORMATION FOR YOUR READERS TO IDENTIFY THE SOURCE ACCURATELY. IF A CITATION BECOMES TOO LONG OR COMPLEX, CONSIDER WHETHER A FOOTNOTE OR ENDNOTE IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM MIGHT BE A BETTER APPROACH.

INTEGRATE SMOOTHLY

IN-TEXT CITATIONS SHOULD NOT FEEL LIKE ABRUPT INTERRUPTIONS TO YOUR PROSE. INTEGRATE THEM NATURALLY INTO YOUR SENTENCES. FOR EXAMPLE, INSTEAD OF WRITING: "RESEARCH SHOWS X. (SMITH 2021, 15)." CONSIDER: "ACCORDING TO SMITH'S RESEARCH, X WAS OBSERVED (2021, 15)."

PROOFREAD METICULOUSLY

ERRORS IN CITATION ARE EASILY OVERLOOKED BUT CAN HAVE SIGNIFICANT CONSEQUENCES. PROOFREAD YOUR DOCUMENT SPECIFICALLY FOR CITATION ACCURACY, CHECKING THAT EVERY IN-TEXT CITATION MATCHES AN ENTRY IN YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY OR REFERENCE LIST AND THAT ALL DETAILS ARE CORRECT.

ADVANCED SCENARIOS AND TROUBLESHOOTING

WHILE THE BASIC RULES OF CHICAGO STYLE IN-TEXT CITATIONS ARE STRAIGHTFORWARD, CERTAIN SITUATIONS CAN PRESENT CHALLENGES. UNDERSTANDING HOW TO HANDLE THESE COMPLEXITIES WILL FURTHER SOLIDIFY YOUR MASTERY OF THE STYLE.

CITING INDIRECT SOURCES

WHEN YOU CITE A SOURCE THAT WAS ITSELF CITED IN ANOTHER SOURCE YOU CONSULTED, YOU SHOULD IDEALLY FIND AND CITE THE ORIGINAL WORK. HOWEVER, IF THIS IS NOT POSSIBLE, CHICAGO STYLE ALLOWS FOR CITING THE INDIRECT SOURCE. IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THIS WOULD APPEAR AS (AUTHOR OF ORIGINAL WORK, CITED IN AUTHOR OF SECONDARY SOURCE YEAR, PAGE).

IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THE NOTE WOULD INDICATE THE ORIGINAL SOURCE AND THEN NOTE THAT IT WAS "CITED IN" THE SECONDARY SOURCE. FOR EXAMPLE: "ORIGINAL AUTHOR, ORIGINAL TITLE (ORIGINAL PUBLICATION DETAILS), PAGE, CITED IN SECONDARY AUTHOR, SECONDARY TITLE (SECONDARY PUBLICATION DETAILS), PAGE."

WHEN PAGE NUMBERS ARE UNAVAILABLE

FOR ONLINE SOURCES OR OTHER MATERIALS THAT DO NOT HAVE TRADITIONAL PAGE NUMBERS, YOU CAN SOMETIMES USE PARAGRAPH NUMBERS OR SECTION HEADINGS TO PINPOINT INFORMATION. IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THIS MIGHT LOOK LIKE (DOE 2023, PARA. 5) OR (DOE 2023, SEC. 3).

IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, YOU WOULD NOTE THE RELEVANT PARAGRAPH OR SECTION IN THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION OR SUBSEQUENT NOTES. ALWAYS AIM FOR THE MOST SPECIFIC LOCATOR AVAILABLE.

MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR IN THE SAME YEAR

IF AN AUTHOR HAS PUBLISHED MULTIPLE WORKS IN THE SAME YEAR, YOU MUST DISTINGUISH THEM IN YOUR CITATIONS. CHICAGO STYLE USES LOWERCASE LETTERS APPENDED TO THE YEAR. FOR EXAMPLE, IF JANE DOE PUBLISHED TWO BOOKS IN 2023, THEY WOULD BE CITED AS (DOE 2023A) AND (DOE 2023B) IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM. THE BIBLIOGRAPHY WOULD LIST THEM IN ALPHABETICAL ORDER BY TITLE AND USE THE SAME DISTINGUISHING LETTERS.

TROUBLESHOOTING COMMON ERRORS

COMMON ERRORS INCLUDE INCORRECT PUNCTUATION WITHIN CITATIONS, MISSING ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS LIKE THE YEAR OR PAGE NUMBER, AND INCONSISTENCIES IN FORMATTING. ALWAYS REFER BACK TO THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE FOR CLARIFICATION ON ANY POINTS OF DOUBT. FAMILIARITY WITH THE STYLE GUIDE IS YOUR MOST RELIABLE TOOL.

FAQ

Q: WHAT IS THE FUNDAMENTAL DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE TWO CHICAGO STYLE IN-TEXT CITATION SYSTEMS?

A: THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE LIES IN THEIR PRESENTATION WITHIN THE TEXT: THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM USES PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS, WHILE THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM USES NUMBERED FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES.

Q: WHEN SHOULD I USE "IBID." IN CHICAGO STYLE NOTES?

A: "IBID." IS USED TO REFER TO THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING NOTE. IF THE CITATION IS TO THE SAME SOURCE AND PAGE AS THE PRECEDING NOTE, SIMPLY USE "IBID." IF IT'S TO THE SAME SOURCE BUT A DIFFERENT PAGE, USE "IBID." FOLLOWED BY THE NEW PAGE NUMBER.

Q: HOW DO I CITE A WEBSITE WITH NO AUTHOR IN THE CHICAGO AUTHOR-DATE STYLE?

A: WHEN A WEBSITE HAS NO AUTHOR, YOU TYPICALLY CITE IT USING THE SHORTENED TITLE OF THE ARTICLE OR WEBPAGE, FOLLOWED BY THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION OR LAST UPDATE. FOR EXAMPLE: ("ARTICLE TITLE" 2023).

Q: WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF A SHORTENED TITLE IN SUBSEQUENT CHICAGO STYLE NOTES?

A: SHORTENED TITLES IN SUBSEQUENT NOTES (IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM) ARE USED TO AVOID REPEATING THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION FOR A SOURCE EVERY TIME IT IS CITED, MAKING THE NOTES MORE CONCISE AND EASIER TO READ.

Q: HOW DO I HANDLE CITING MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR PUBLISHED IN THE SAME YEAR USING CHICAGO STYLE?

A: YOU DISTINGUISH THESE WORKS BY APPENDING LOWERCASE LETTERS (A, B, C, ETC.) TO THE YEAR IN BOTH THE IN-TEXT CITATIONS AND THE BIBLIOGRAPHY (E.G., SMITH 2022A, SMITH 2022B).

Q: IS IT ACCEPTABLE TO USE INDIRECT SOURCES IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: CHICAGO STYLE PERMITS CITING INDIRECT SOURCES WHEN THE ORIGINAL WORK CANNOT BE ACCESSED. THE CITATION FORMAT INDICATES THAT THE INFORMATION WAS OBTAINED THROUGH A SECONDARY SOURCE, FOR EXAMPLE, "(AUTHOR OF ORIGINAL, CITED IN AUTHOR OF SECONDARY 2023, 12)."

Q: WHAT IS THE RECOMMENDED APPROACH FOR CITING ONLINE ARTICLES WITHOUT PAGE NUMBERS IN CHICAGO STYLE?

A: FOR ONLINE ARTICLES LACKING PAGE NUMBERS, CHICAGO STYLE RECOMMENDS USING PARAGRAPH NUMBERS OR SECTION HEADINGS TO PINPOINT THE SPECIFIC LOCATION OF THE CITED MATERIAL IN BOTH AUTHOR-DATE AND NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEMS.

Q: HOW SHOULD I FORMAT THE TITLE OF A JOURNAL ARTICLE IN CHICAGO STYLE IN-TEXT CITATIONS?

A: IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THE ARTICLE TITLE IS TYPICALLY ENCLOSED IN QUOTATION MARKS WITHIN THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION IF IT'S PART OF A LARGER WORK, SIMILAR TO HOW IT WOULD APPEAR IN THE REFERENCE LIST. IN NOTES, THE ARTICLE TITLE IS ALWAYS IN QUOTATION MARKS.

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
