## UNDERSTANDING THE BASICS OF CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS FOR QUOTES

THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE (CMOS) OFFERS TWO PRIMARY SYSTEMS FOR CITATION: THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM AND THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM. WHEN IT COMES TO PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS FOR QUOTES, THE APPROACH DIFFERS SLIGHTLY BETWEEN THESE TWO SYSTEMS. THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM IS MORE COMMON IN THE SCIENCES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES, RELYING ON BRIEF IN-TEXT CITATIONS THAT POINT READERS TO A FULL REFERENCE LIST AT THE END OF THE WORK. THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, OFTEN PREFERRED IN THE HUMANITIES, USES FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES FOR FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION, WITH ABBREVIATED PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS IN THE TEXT WHEN NECESSARY TO DIRECT READERS TO THE CORRECT NOTE. FOR DIRECT QUOTES, CLARITY AND ACCURACY ARE PARAMOUNT, REGARDLESS OF THE CHOSEN SYSTEM.

THE FUNDAMENTAL PURPOSE OF ANY CITATION IS TO PROVIDE READERS WITH THE INFORMATION THEY NEED TO LOCATE THE ORIGINAL SOURCE. WHEN YOU USE A DIRECT QUOTATION, YOU ARE BORROWING THE EXACT WORDS OF ANOTHER AUTHOR. THEREFORE, YOUR CITATION MUST CLEARLY AND UNAMBIGUOUSLY INDICATE WHICH WORDS ARE YOURS AND WHICH BELONG TO THE ORIGINAL SOURCE, ALONG WITH WHERE THOSE WORDS CAN BE FOUND. THIS NOT ONLY AVOIDS PLAGIARISM BUT ALSO ALLOWS YOUR AUDIENCE TO VERIFY YOUR INTERPRETATION AND EXPLORE THE SOURCE MATERIAL FURTHER.

## KEY COMPONENTS OF A CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR QUOTES

REGARDLESS OF WHETHER YOU ARE USING THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM OR THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM WITH PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS, CERTAIN ESSENTIAL PIECES OF INFORMATION ARE TYPICALLY INCLUDED TO IDENTIFY THE SOURCE OF A DIRECT QUOTE. THESE COMPONENTS HELP ENSURE THAT YOUR READER CAN PINPOINT THE EXACT LOCATION OF THE QUOTED MATERIAL WITHIN THE ORIGINAL PUBLICATION.

## ESSENTIAL INFORMATION FOR IDENTIFYING A QUOTE'S SOURCE

- **AUTHOR'S LAST NAME:** THIS IS THE PRIMARY IDENTIFIER, ALLOWING READERS TO DISTINGUISH BETWEEN DIFFERENT SOURCES WITHIN YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY OR REFERENCE LIST.
- **PUBLICATION YEAR (AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM):** IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION IS A CRUCIAL ELEMENT TO DIFFERENTIATE BETWEEN MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR.
- **PAGE NUMBER(S):** THIS IS ARGUABLY THE MOST CRITICAL COMPONENT FOR DIRECT QUOTES, AS IT TELLS THE READER PRECISELY WHERE THE QUOTED PASSAGE APPEARS. FOR DIRECT QUOTATIONS, OMITTING THE PAGE NUMBER IS ALMOST ALWAYS INCORRECT.
- **CHAPTER OR SECTION NUMBER (FOR SOURCES WITHOUT TRADITIONAL PAGE NUMBERS):** SOME DIGITAL OR OLDER TEXTS MAY USE CHAPTER OR SECTION NUMBERS INSTEAD OF, OR IN ADDITION TO, PAGE NUMBERS.

## AUTHOR-PAGE NUMBER SYSTEM (NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY STYLE)

WHILE THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM PRIMARILY RELIES ON FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES FOR DETAILED SOURCE INFORMATION, PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS ARE STILL EMPLOYED, PARTICULARLY FOR BREVITY AND TO DIRECT READERS TO THE APPROPRIATE NOTE. WHEN A PARENTHETICAL CITATION IS USED IN THE TEXT WITH THIS SYSTEM, IT TYPICALLY INCLUDES THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE PAGE NUMBER FROM WHICH THE QUOTE IS TAKEN. THIS IS A CONCISE METHOD DESIGNED TO AVOID CLUTTERING THE PROSE WHILE STILL PROVIDING ESSENTIAL LOCATIONAL DATA.

## WHEN TO USE PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS IN NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY STYLE

PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY STYLE ARE GENERALLY USED WHEN THE AUTHOR'S NAME IS NOT MENTIONED IN THE SENTENCE INTRODUCING THE QUOTE. IF YOU HAVE ALREADY NAMED THE AUTHOR, YOU MAY ONLY NEED TO PROVIDE THE PAGE NUMBER. HOWEVER, IT IS BEST PRACTICE TO INCLUDE BOTH THE AUTHOR'S NAME AND PAGE NUMBER IF THERE IS ANY POSSIBILITY OF CONFUSION, ESPECIALLY IF YOU ARE CITING MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR.

FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU ARE QUOTING FROM A BOOK BY JOHN SMITH PUBLISHED IN 2015, AND YOUR SENTENCE INTRODUCING THE QUOTE DOES NOT MENTION SMITH, THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION WOULD APPEAR AS FOLLOWS: "THE PROFOUND IMPLICATIONS OF THIS DISCOVERY WERE IMMEDIATELY APPARENT" (SMITH 45).

## HANDLING MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR

WHEN CITING MULTIPLE WORKS BY THE SAME AUTHOR, IT BECOMES ESSENTIAL TO DIFFERENTIATE THEM. IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THIS IS TYPICALLY ACHIEVED BY ADDING A SHORTENED VERSION OF THE TITLE TO THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION. THIS ENSURES THAT READERS CAN CORRECTLY MATCH THE IN-TEXT CITATION TO THE CORRESPONDING FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY IN YOUR NOTES OR BIBLIOGRAPHY.

CONSIDER A SCENARIO WHERE YOU ARE CITING TWO BOOKS BY JOHN SMITH. THE FIRST MIGHT BE TITLED "EARLY AMERICAN HISTORY" AND THE SECOND "THE CIVIL WAR ERA." YOUR PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS WOULD THEN LOOK LIKE THIS: "THE POLITICAL CLIMATE WAS HIGHLY CHARGED" (SMITH, EARLY AMERICAN HISTORY 45) AND "THE BATTLE WAS A TURNING POINT" (SMITH, CIVIL WAR ERA 112).

# AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM (AUTHOR-DATE STYLE)

THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, AS ITS NAME SUGGESTS, RELIES ON BRIEF PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS THAT INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE YEAR OF PUBLICATION. FOR DIRECT QUOTES, THE PAGE NUMBER IS ALSO INDISPENSABLE. THIS SYSTEM CREATES A DIRECT LINK BETWEEN THE IN-TEXT CITATION AND THE FULL ENTRY IN THE REFERENCE LIST AT THE END OF YOUR DOCUMENT. IT IS CHARACTERIZED BY ITS EFFICIENCY AND DIRECTNESS IN CONVEYING SOURCE INFORMATION.

## STRUCTURE OF AUTHOR-DATE PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS FOR QUOTES

THE STANDARD FORMAT FOR AN AUTHOR-DATE PARENTHETICAL CITATION WHEN QUOTING DIRECTLY IS (AUTHOR LAST NAME YEAR, PAGE NUMBER). FOR INSTANCE, IF YOU ARE QUOTING FROM A SOURCE BY JANE DOE PUBLISHED IN 2020, THE CITATION WOULD BE (DOE 2020, 18). THIS FORMAT CLEARLY IDENTIFIES THE AUTHOR, THE PUBLICATION YEAR, AND THE PRECISE LOCATION OF THE QUOTE.

## INTEGRATING AUTHOR AND DATE WITHIN THE SENTENCE

SIMILAR TO THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, IF THE AUTHOR'S NAME IS ALREADY MENTIONED IN YOUR PROSE, YOU MAY BE ABLE TO OMIT IT FROM THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION. IN SUCH CASES, YOU WOULD INCLUDE THE YEAR AND PAGE NUMBER. FOR EXAMPLE, "AS DOE (2020) ARGUES, 'THE SOCIETAL IMPACT WAS TRANSFORMATIVE' (18)." HOWEVER, THE CONVENTION IS TO INCLUDE THE YEAR IN THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION EVEN WHEN THE AUTHOR IS NAMED, TO MAINTAIN CONSISTENCY WITH THE REFERENCE LIST.

## INTEGRATING QUOTES AND CITATIONS SMOOTHLY

THE ART OF INCORPORATING DIRECT QUOTES INTO YOUR WRITING IS NOT JUST ABOUT PLACING THEM ON THE PAGE; IT'S ABOUT WEAVING THEM SEAMLESSLY INTO YOUR OWN ARGUMENTS. EFFECTIVE INTEGRATION INVOLVES INTRODUCING THE QUOTE, PRESENTING IT ACCURATELY, AND FOLLOWING IT WITH A CORRECT PARENTHETICAL CITATION. THE GOAL IS TO MAKE THE QUOTE SERVE YOUR PURPOSE WITHOUT DISRUPTING THE FLOW OF YOUR WRITING.

## INTRODUCING DIRECT QUOTES

A DIRECT QUOTE SHOULD NEVER STAND ALONE. IT NEEDS AN INTRODUCTORY PHRASE OR CLAUSE THAT CONTEXTUALIZES IT AND EXPLAINS ITS RELEVANCE TO YOUR POINT. THIS INTRODUCTION CAN BE AS SIMPLE AS "ACCORDING TO SMITH," OR MORE ELABORATE, SETTING UP THE QUOTE WITH BACKGROUND INFORMATION. FOR EXAMPLE: "IN HER SEMINAL WORK ON URBAN PLANNING, PROFESSOR DAVIES ASSERTS THAT 'GREEN SPACES ARE VITAL FOR COMMUNITY WELL-BEING' (DAVIES 78)."

## ATTRIBUTING THE QUOTE

ENSURE THAT THE ATTRIBUTION IS CLEAR. IF THE AUTHOR'S NAME IS NOT PART OF YOUR INTRODUCTORY PHRASE, IT MUST BE INCLUDED IN THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION. CONSISTENCY IS KEY; ALWAYS FOLLOW THE CHOSEN STYLE GUIDE (EITHER AUTHOR-DATE OR NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY) METICULOUSLY. IF YOU ARE QUOTING A SPEECH OR A LECTURE, YOU WOULD CITE THE SPEAKER AND THE DATE, POTENTIALLY A SLIDE OR TIMESTAMP IF APPLICABLE AND IF THE MEDIUM ALLOWS FOR SUCH PRECISE REFERENCING.

## HANDLING SPECIFIC SOURCE TYPES IN PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS

DIFFERENT TYPES OF SOURCES REQUIRE SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT APPROACHES TO PARENTHETICAL CITATION. WHILE THE CORE PRINCIPLES REMAIN THE SAME, VARIATIONS EXIST FOR DIGITAL MEDIA, INTERVIEWS, AND WORKS WITH MULTIPLE AUTHORS.

## CITING ONLINE SOURCES

FOR ONLINE SOURCES THAT LACK TRADITIONAL PAGE NUMBERS, YOU MAY NEED TO USE OTHER LOCATORS SUCH AS PARAGRAPH NUMBERS, SECTION HEADINGS, OR TIMESTAMPS FOR AUDIO/VIDEO. THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE SUGGESTS USING PARAGRAPH NUMBERS (PRECEDED BY "PAR.") IF AVAILABLE, OR A SECTION HEADING. FOR EXAMPLE: (SMITH, PAR. 5) OR (DOE, "CONCLUSION").

## CITING INTERVIEWS

WHEN CITING INTERVIEWS, WHETHER PUBLISHED OR CONDUCTED BY YOU, THE CITATION TYPICALLY INCLUDES THE INTERVIEWEE'S NAME AND THE DATE OF THE INTERVIEW. FOR UNPUBLISHED INTERVIEWS YOU CONDUCTED, YOU MIGHT CITE (JANE DOE, PERSONAL INTERVIEW, OCTOBER 26, 2023). FOR PUBLISHED INTERVIEWS, FOLLOW THE STANDARD AUTHOR-DATE OR AUTHOR-PAGE FORMAT IF PAGE NUMBERS ARE PROVIDED.

## CITING WORKS WITH MULTIPLE AUTHORS

FOR WORKS WITH TWO AUTHORS, LIST BOTH LAST NAMES IN THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION, CONNECTED BY "AND": (SMITH AND JONES 150). FOR WORKS WITH THREE OR MORE AUTHORS, CITE ONLY THE FIRST AUTHOR'S LAST NAME FOLLOWED BY "ET AL." (MEANING "AND OTHERS"): (SMITH ET AL. 210). ENSURE YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY OR REFERENCE LIST PROVIDES THE FULL LIST OF AUTHORS.

## COMMON CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS IN CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS

WRITERS OFTEN ENCOUNTER SPECIFIC DIFFICULTIES WHEN APPLYING PARENTHETICAL CITATION RULES, PARTICULARLY WITH DIRECT QUOTES. UNDERSTANDING THESE COMMON ISSUES AND THEIR RESOLUTIONS CAN PREVENT ERRORS AND ENSURE THE INTEGRITY OF YOUR WORK.

## MISSING PUBLICATION INFORMATION

IF A SOURCE LACKS A PUBLICATION DATE OR PAGE NUMBERS, IT PRESENTS A CHALLENGE. FOR WORKS WITHOUT A DATE, CMOS SUGGESTS USING "N.D." (NO DATE) IN PLACE OF THE YEAR. IF PAGE NUMBERS ARE UNAVAILABLE, AS WITH SOME WEB PAGES OR CERTAIN EDITIONS, YOU MIGHT RELY ON PARAGRAPH NUMBERS, SECTION TITLES, OR OTHER LOGICAL DIVISIONS OF THE TEXT, AS DISCUSSED PREVIOUSLY. ALWAYS STRIVE FOR THE MOST PRECISE LOCATOR POSSIBLE.

## INDIRECT SOURCES

WHEN YOU CITE A SOURCE THAT IS QUOTED IN ANOTHER SOURCE (AN INDIRECT CITATION), IT'S IMPORTANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE BOTH. THE RULE OF THUMB IS TO CITE THE ORIGINAL SOURCE BUT INDICATE THAT YOU ACCESSED IT THROUGH A SECONDARY SOURCE. THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION WOULD LOOK SOMETHING LIKE: (AS QUOTED IN SMITH 45). YOUR BIBLIOGRAPHY OR REFERENCE LIST SHOULD IDEALLY INCLUDE THE SECONDARY SOURCE YOU CONSULTED, NOT THE ORIGINAL UNLESS YOU ALSO READ IT.

# ADVANCED CONSIDERATIONS FOR CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS

BEYOND THE FUNDAMENTAL RULES, THERE ARE ADVANCED SCENARIOS AND STYLISTIC CHOICES THAT CAN ENHANCE THE CLARITY AND SOPHISTICATION OF YOUR CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS FOR QUOTES.

## CITING EDITED VOLUMES

WHEN QUOTING FROM A CHAPTER IN AN EDITED VOLUME, THE CITATION SHOULD TYPICALLY INCLUDE THE AUTHOR OF THE CHAPTER, FOLLOWED BY THE PAGE NUMBER. THE EDITOR'S NAME AND THE TITLE OF THE VOLUME WILL APPEAR IN THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRY. FOR INSTANCE, IF YOU ARE QUOTING FROM A CHAPTER BY ROBERT MILLER IN A VOLUME EDITED BY SUSAN CLARK, THE PARENTHETICAL CITATION WOULD BE (MILLER 215).

## CITING PERFORMANCES AND MEDIA

FOR CITING SPECIFIC MOMENTS IN FILMS, PLAYS, OR OTHER PERFORMANCES, PAGE NUMBERS ARE USUALLY REPLACED BY TIMESTAMPS OR ACT/SCENE/LINE NUMBERS. FOR A FILM, YOU MIGHT CITE (DIRECTOR, YEAR, TIMESTAMP), E.G., (NOLAN, 2010, 01:32:15). FOR A PLAY, IT WOULD BE (PLAYWRIGHT, ACT.SCENE.LINE), E.G., (SHAKESPEARE, HAMLET 3.1.56-60).

## THE CHOICE BETWEEN PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS AND NOTES

WHILE THIS ARTICLE FOCUSES ON PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS FOR QUOTES WITHIN THE TEXT, REMEMBER THAT IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, THE PRIMARY METHOD OF CITATION IS THROUGH FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES. PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS IN THIS STYLE ARE OFTEN USED AS A SUPPLEMENTARY OR ABBREVIATED FORM TO GUIDE READERS TO THE CORRECT NOTE. THE DECISION TO USE PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS FOR QUOTES IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM SHOULD BE MADE WITH AN EYE TOWARD MAINTAINING READABILITY AND AVOIDING EXCESSIVE INTERRUPTION OF YOUR PROSE. IT IS OFTEN A MATTER OF STYLISTIC PREFERENCE OR INSTRUCTOR GUIDELINES.

### FAQ SECTION

#### **Q: WHAT IS THE PRIMARY DIFFERENCE BETWEEN PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS IN CHICAGO STYLE'S AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM AND ITS NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM WHEN QUOTING?**

A: IN THE AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM, PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS FOR QUOTES WILL ALWAYS INCLUDE THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, THE PUBLICATION YEAR, AND THE PAGE NUMBER (E.G., (SMITH 2020, 45)). IN THE NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM, WHEN PARENTHETICAL CITATIONS ARE USED FOR QUOTES, THEY TYPICALLY INCLUDE ONLY THE AUTHOR'S LAST NAME AND THE PAGE NUMBER (E.G., (SMITH 45)), WITH THE FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION RESIDING IN FOOTNOTES OR ENDNOTES.

#### **Q: MUST I ALWAYS INCLUDE THE PAGE NUMBER WHEN USING A CHICAGO STYLE PARENTHETICAL CITATION FOR A DIRECT QUOTE?**

A: YES, FOR DIRECT QUOTATIONS, THE PAGE NUMBER IS ALMOST ALWAYS ESSENTIAL IN CHICAGO STYLE, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER YOU ARE USING THE AUTHOR-DATE OR NOTES-BIBLIOGRAPHY SYSTEM. THIS IS BECAUSE A DIRECT QUOTE IS VERBATIM TEXT, AND THE READER NEEDS TO KNOW PRECISELY WHERE IT APPEARS IN THE SOURCE.

## Q: How do I cite a quote from a website that doesn't have page numbers in Chicago style parenthetical citations?

A: If a website lacks traditional page numbers, Chicago style recommends using paragraph numbers if available (preceded by "par."), or a section heading. For example, you might cite (Doe, par. 7) or (Smith, "Methodology").

## Q: What if I'm quoting a passage that is found in multiple places within a source?

A: If a source has different pagination for different editions or formats (like print vs. electronic), you should use the pagination of the specific edition you consulted. If a source has no pagination, but uses another locator like chapter or section numbers, cite that locator.

## Q: How should I format a parenthetical citation for a quote from a source with three or more authors in Chicago style?

A: For sources with three or more authors in Chicago style's author-date system, you cite the first author's last name followed by "et al." and the year and page number (e.g., (Smith et al. 2021, 150)). In the notes-bibliography system, it would be (Smith et al. 150).

## Q: Can I mention the author's name in my sentence and still use a parenthetical citation in Chicago style?

A: Yes. If the author's name is part of your sentence introducing the quote, you can omit it from the parenthetical citation in the notes-bibliography system, only including the page number (e.g., "As Smith states, 'the data was conclusive' (45)"). However, in the author-date system, it is generally recommended to still include the year, and sometimes the page number, even when the author is named in the text, for consistency with the reference list (e.g., "As Smith (2021) states, 'the data was conclusive' (45)").

## Q: What is the correct way to cite an indirect source in Chicago style?

A: When citing a work that quotes another work, cite the secondary source in your parenthetical citation and indicate that it's an indirect citation. The format is typically (as quoted in author of secondary source, page number) or (author of original work, as quoted in author of secondary source, page number). Your bibliography will list the secondary source.

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
