UNVEILING THE BLIND SPOTS: COLD WAR INTELLIGENCE FAILURES IN THE WAR ON POVERTY

COLD WAR INTELLIGENCE FAILURES IN THE WAR ON POVERTY REPRESENT A CRITICAL, OFTEN OVERLOOKED, ASPECT OF AMERICAN DOMESTIC POLICY DURING A PERIOD OF INTENSE GEOPOLITICAL STRUGGLE. WHILE MUCH ATTENTION WAS PAID TO ESPIONAGE AND MILITARY THREATS FROM THE SOVIET UNION, THE INTELLIGENCE APPARATUS ALSO GRAPPLED WITH UNDERSTANDING AND INFLUENCING INTERNAL SOCIETAL CHALLENGES. THIS ARTICLE DELVES INTO HOW THE COLD WAR'S PERVERSIVE ATMOSPHERE OF SUSPICION, ITS IDEOLOGICAL BATTLES, AND THE INHERENT LIMITATIONS OF INTELLIGENCE GATHERING LED TO SIGNIFICANT MISSTEPS AND MISSED OPPORTUNITIES IN ADDRESSING POVERTY WITHIN THE UNITED STATES. WE WILL EXPLORE THE INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY'S PERCEPTION OF DOMESTIC UNREST, ITS ROLE IN SHAPING ANTI-POVERTY INITIATIVES, AND THE LASTING CONSEQUENCES OF THESE BLIND SPOTS. UNDERSTANDING THESE FAILURES OFFERS CRUCIAL LESSONS FOR CONTEMPORARY POLICY AND THE ONGOING FIGHT AGAINST INEQUALITY.

THE COLD WAR LENS: HOW GEOPOLITICAL FEARS SHAPED DOMESTIC POLICY PERCEPTION

THE OVERARCHING CONTEXT OF THE COLD WAR PROFOUNDLY INFLUENCED HOW AMERICAN INSTITUTIONS, INCLUDING INTELLIGENCE AGENCIES, VIEWED DOMESTIC ISSUES. THE EXISTENTIAL THREAT POSED BY COMMUNISM CREATED AN ENVIRONMENT WHERE ANY FORM OF SOCIAL OR ECONOMIC DISCONTENT WAS OFTEN VIEWED THROUGH THE PRISM OF SOVIET INFLUENCE OR MANIPULATION. THIS BINARY THINKING, "US VERSUS THEM," BLURRED THE LINES BETWEEN LEGITIMATE SOCIAL GRIEVANCES AND PERCEIVED EXTERNAL THREATS. INTELLIGENCE GATHERING AND ANALYSIS, THEREFORE, BECAME HEAVILY SKEWED TOWARDS IDENTIFYING POTENTIAL SUBVERSION RATHER THAN UNDERSTANDING THE ROOT CAUSES OF SOCIETAL PROBLEMS LIKE POVERTY. THE IMPERATIVE TO MAINTAIN NATIONAL UNITY AND PROJECT AN IMAGE OF STRENGTH AGAINST A GLOBAL ADVERSARY OFTEN OVERSHADOWED THE COMPLEX REALITIES OF INTERNAL ECONOMIC DISPARITIES AND SOCIAL INJUSTICES.

THIS HEIGHTENED SENSE OF VIGILANCE MEANT THAT DOMESTIC ACTIVISM, LABOR MOVEMENTS, AND CIVIL RIGHTS PROTESTS WERE FREQUENTLY SUBJECTED TO INTENSE SCRUTINY BY INTELLIGENCE BODIES. THE ASSUMPTION WAS OFTEN THAT THESE MOVEMENTS, IF THEY GAINED TRACTION, COULD BE EXPLOITED BY COMMUNIST FORCES. THIS LED TO THE UNWARRANTED SURVEILLANCE OF INDIVIDUALS AND GROUPS WHO WERE PRIMARILY CONCERNED WITH IMPROVING LIVING CONDITIONS AND SECURING BASIC RIGHTS FOR MARGINALIZED COMMUNITIES. THE INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY'S FOCUS WAS LESS ON PROVIDING ACTIONABLE INSIGHTS INTO THE LIVED EXPERIENCES OF THE IMPOVERISHED AND MORE ON CATALOGING POTENTIAL THREATS TO THE ESTABLISHED ORDER, WHICH WAS ITSELF SEEN AS A BULWARK AGAINST COMMUNISM.

INTELLIGENCE AND THE PERCEPTION OF POVERTY: MISINTERPRETING SOCIAL UNREST

ONE OF THE MOST SIGNIFICANT INTELLIGENCE FAILURES DURING THE WAR ON POVERTY WAS THE MISINTERPRETATION OF SOCIAL UNREST AS A DIRECT CONSEQUENCE OF COMMUNIST AGITATION RATHER THAN A LEGITIMATE RESPONSE TO SYSTEMIC ECONOMIC HARDSHIP. INTELLIGENCE REPORTS OFTEN FOCUSED ON THE PRESENCE OF KNOWN OR SUSPECTED COMMUNIST SYMPATHIZERS WITHIN ACTIVIST GROUPS, OVEREMPHASIZING THEIR INFLUENCE WHILE DOWNPLAYING THE GENUINE GRIEVANCES DRIVING THE MAJORITY OF PARTICIPANTS. THIS LED TO A DISTORTED UNDERSTANDING OF THE DRIVERS OF POVERTY, FRAMING IT LESS AS AN ECONOMIC ISSUE REQUIRING SOCIAL AND GOVERNMENTAL SOLUTIONS AND MORE AS A SECURITY CHALLENGE TO BE CONTAINED.

THE INTELLIGENCE APPARATUS WAS TASKED WITH ASSESSING THE LOYALTY OF AMERICAN CITIZENS AND IDENTIFYING POTENTIAL THREATS TO NATIONAL SECURITY. IN THE CONTEXT OF THE WAR ON POVERTY, THIS OFTEN TRANSLATED INTO VIEWING COMMUNITY ORGANIZERS, UNION LEADERS, AND ADVOCATES FOR THE POOR WITH SUSPICION. INSTEAD OF RECOGNIZING THESE INDIVIDUALS AS ESSENTIAL CONDUITS FOR UNDERSTANDING THE NEEDS OF IMPOVERISHED COMMUNITIES, INTELLIGENCE AGENCIES SOMETIMES CLASSIFIED THEM AS POTENTIAL AGENTS OF FOREIGN INFLUENCE. THIS CREATED A CHILLING EFFECT ON GRASSROOTS ORGANIZING AND MADE IT DIFFICULT FOR POLICYMAKERS TO RECEIVE UNFILTERED, ACCURATE INFORMATION ABOUT THE LIVED REALITIES OF POVERTY.

MONITORING DISSENT AND ITS IMPACT ON PROGRAM DESIGN

THE SURVEILLANCE OF DISSENT, A COMMON PRACTICE DURING THE COLD WAR, DIRECTLY IMPACTED THE DESIGN AND IMPLEMENTATION OF ANTI-POVERTY PROGRAMS. INTELLIGENCE AGENCIES, SUCH AS THE FBI UNDER J. EDGAR HOOVER, MAINTAINED EXTENSIVE FILES ON CIVIL RIGHTS LEADERS AND COMMUNITY ACTIVISTS, OFTEN LABELING THEM AS RADICALS OR SUBVERSIVES. THIS CREATED AN ENVIRONMENT WHERE PROGRAMS AIMED AT ALLEVIATING POVERTY COULD BE INFLUENCED BY A DESIRE TO PACIFY OR CONTROL PERCEIVED THREATS, RATHER THAN BY A GENUINE COMMITMENT TO EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES. THE FOCUS SHIFTED FROM ADDRESSING THE UNDERLYING CAUSES OF POVERTY, SUCH AS LACK OF EDUCATION, JOB OPPORTUNITIES, AND HEALTHCARE, TO MANAGING THE VISIBLE SYMPTOMS OF DISCONTENT.

FURTHERMORE, THE FEAR OF BEING ASSOCIATED WITH "SUBVERSIVE ELEMENTS" COULD LEAD TO A RELUCTANCE AMONG MAINSTREAM POLITICIANS AND BUREAUCRATS TO SUPPORT TRULY TRANSFORMATIVE ANTI-POVERTY INITIATIVES. INTELLIGENCE REPORTS, EVEN IF EXAGGERATED OR INACCURATE, CARRIED WEIGHT AND COULD SHAPE POLICY DECISIONS BY FRAMING CERTAIN APPROACHES AS RISKY OR POLITICALLY UNTENABLE. THIS OFTEN RESULTED IN THE ADOPTION OF MORE INCREMENTAL AND LESS EFFECTIVE SOLUTIONS, WHICH FAILED TO ADDRESS THE DEEP-SEATED STRUCTURAL ISSUES CONTRIBUTING TO PERSISTENT POVERTY. THE INTELLIGENCE NARRATIVE SUBTLY INFLUENCED THE POLITICAL WILL TO ENACT BOLD, SYSTEMIC CHANGES.

THE ECONOMIC INTELLIGENCE DIMENSION: UNDERESTIMATING INTERNAL WEAKNESSES

WHILE THE COLD WAR FOCUSED HEAVILY ON ECONOMIC COMPETITION WITH THE SOVIET UNION, THE INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY'S FOCUS ON EXTERNAL ECONOMIC THREATS SOMETIMES LED TO AN UNDERESTIMATION OF INTERNAL ECONOMIC WEAKNESSES THAT FUELED POVERTY. THE ECONOMIC INTELLIGENCE GATHERED WAS PRIMARILY AIMED AT UNDERSTANDING SOVIET INDUSTRIAL CAPACITY, TECHNOLOGICAL ADVANCEMENTS, AND FINANCIAL STABILITY. THERE WAS LESS EMPHASIS ON THE GRANULAR ANALYSIS OF DOMESTIC ECONOMIC INEQUALITIES, THE IMPACT OF DEINDUSTRIALIZATION ON CERTAIN COMMUNITIES, OR THE STRUCTURAL BARRIERS THAT TRAPPED GENERATIONS IN CYCLES OF POVERTY. THIS CREATED A BLIND SPOT REGARDING THE INTERNAL ECONOMIC VULNERABILITIES THAT THE WAR ON POVERTY WAS INTENDED TO ADDRESS.

CONSEQUENTLY, POLICY SOLUTIONS WERE OFTEN DESIGNED WITHOUT A FULL APPRECIATION OF THE ECONOMIC REALITIES ON THE GROUND. INSTEAD OF ADDRESSING ISSUES LIKE WAGE STAGNATION, DISCRIMINATORY LENDING PRACTICES, OR THE DECLINE OF MANUFACTURING JOBS IN SPECIFIC REGIONS, POLICIES MIGHT HAVE FOCUSED ON GENERAL ECONOMIC GROWTH THAT DID NOT TRICKLE DOWN EFFECTIVELY TO THE MOST IMPOVERISHED SEGMENTS OF SOCIETY. THE INTELLIGENCE FRAMEWORK WAS NOT OPTIMALLY GEARED TOWARDS PROVIDING THE DETAILED ECONOMIC DIAGNOSTICS NECESSARY FOR TRULY EFFECTIVE POVERTY ALLEVIATION, PRIORITIZING INSTEAD THE PERCEIVED EXTERNAL ECONOMIC THREAT.

OVERLOOKING GRASSROOTS MOVEMENTS: THE FAILURE TO GRASP TRUE NEEDS

A CRITICAL FAILURE OF INTELLIGENCE GATHERING IN THIS ERA WAS ITS INABILITY TO ACCURATELY ASSESS AND UNDERSTAND THE AUTHENTIC NEEDS AND ASPIRATIONS OF IMPOVERISHED COMMUNITIES. THE EMPHASIS ON IDENTIFYING EXTERNAL THREATS MEANT THAT THE VOICES AND PERSPECTIVES OF THOSE MOST AFFECTED BY POVERTY WERE OFTEN FILTERED THROUGH A LENS OF SUSPICION OR DISMISSED AS THE PRODUCT OF MANIPULATION. GRASSROOTS MOVEMENTS, WHICH COULD HAVE PROVIDED INVALUABLE INSIGHTS INTO THE PRACTICAL CHALLENGES AND EFFECTIVE SOLUTIONS, WERE OFTEN VIEWED AS POTENTIAL SITES OF RADICALIZATION RATHER THAN AS VITAL SOURCES OF INFORMATION AND PARTNERSHIP.

THIS OVERSIGHT RESULTED IN PROGRAMS THAT WERE SOMETIMES ILL-SUITED TO THE COMMUNITIES THEY WERE MEANT TO SERVE. WITHOUT A DEEP UNDERSTANDING OF LOCAL CONTEXTS, CULTURAL NUANCES, AND THE SPECIFIC BARRIERS FACED BY DIFFERENT GROUPS, WELL-INTENTIONED INITIATIVES COULD FALTER OR EVEN PROVE COUNTERPRODUCTIVE. THE INTELLIGENCE APPARATUS, BY FOCUSING ON PERCEIVED THREATS RATHER THAN ON FOSTERING GENUINE UNDERSTANDING, MISSED OPPORTUNITIES TO CONNECT POLICYMAKERS WITH THE VERY POPULATIONS WHOSE LIVES THEY WERE ATTEMPTING TO IMPROVE. THIS CREATED A DISCONNECT BETWEEN POLICY INTENTIONS AND ON-THE-GROUND REALITIES.

THE CONSEQUENCES OF MISGUIDED INTELLIGENCE

THE INTELLIGENCE FAILURES ASSOCIATED WITH THE COLD WAR'S INFLUENCE ON THE WAR ON POVERTY HAD FAR-REACHING AND DETRIMENTAL CONSEQUENCES. THE WARPED PERCEPTIONS AND MISINTERPRETATIONS STEMMING FROM GEOPOLITICAL ANXIETIES DIRECTLY IMPACTED THE EFFECTIVENESS AND DIRECTION OF DOMESTIC ANTI-POVERTY INITIATIVES. THIS LED TO A PERPETUATION OF CYCLES OF POVERTY AND UNDERMINED EFFORTS TO BUILD MORE EQUITABLE AND INCLUSIVE SOCIETIES.

RESOURCE MISALLOCATION AND INEFFECTIVE PROGRAMS

WHEN INTELLIGENCE ASSESSMENTS INCORRECTLY IDENTIFIED THE DRIVERS OF POVERTY OR OVEREMPHASIZED THE ROLE OF EXTERNAL AGITATORS, RESOURCES WERE OFTEN MISDIRECTED. INSTEAD OF INVESTING IN PROVEN SOCIAL PROGRAMS THAT ADDRESSED EDUCATION, JOB TRAINING, AND HEALTHCARE, FUNDS MIGHT HAVE BEEN DIVERTED TO SURVEILLANCE ACTIVITIES OR TO PROGRAMS DESIGNED FOR SOCIAL CONTROL RATHER THAN SOCIAL UPLIFT. THIS MISALLOCATION MEANT THAT CRITICAL RESOURCES FAILED TO REACH THE COMMUNITIES MOST IN NEED, AND THE POTENTIAL IMPACT OF THE WAR ON POVERTY WAS SIGNIFICANTLY DIMINISHED. PROGRAMS THAT WERE IMPLEMENTED OFTEN LACKED THE DEPTH AND TAILORED APPROACH NECESSARY TO OVERCOME ENTRENCHED POVERTY BECAUSE THEIR DESIGN WAS INFORMED BY FLAWED INTELLIGENCE, NOT BY AN ACCURATE

EROSION OF TRUST AND COMMUNITY RELATIONS

THE PERVERSIVE SURVEILLANCE AND OFTEN UNFOUNDED SUSPICIONS CAST UPON COMMUNITY ORGANIZERS AND ACTIVISTS BY INTELLIGENCE AGENCIES LED TO A DEEP EROSION OF TRUST BETWEEN GOVERNMENT INSTITUTIONS AND THE COMMUNITIES THEY WERE SUPPOSED TO SERVE. WHEN PEOPLE FELT THEY WERE BEING WATCHED, JUDGED, AND POTENTIALLY TARGETED FOR THEIR ACTIVISM OR EVEN THEIR SOCIOECONOMIC STATUS, IT CREATED AN ATMOSPHERE OF FEAR AND ALIENATION. THIS MISTRUST MADE IT HARDER TO BUILD THE COLLABORATIVE RELATIONSHIPS NECESSARY FOR SUCCESSFUL POVERTY ALLEVIATION EFFORTS. COMMUNITIES BECAME MORE RELUCTANT TO ENGAGE WITH GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS, AND GENUINE DIALOGUE ABOUT PRESSING ISSUES BECAME INCREASINGLY DIFFICULT.

THE PERPETUATION OF SOCIAL DIVIDES

BY FRAMING POVERTY AND ASSOCIATED UNREST AS SECURITY THREATS RATHER THAN AS COMPLEX SOCIO-ECONOMIC ISSUES, INTELLIGENCE FAILURES INADVERTENTLY CONTRIBUTED TO THE PERPETUATION OF SOCIAL DIVIDES. THE FOCUS ON COMBATING A PERCEIVED EXTERNAL ENEMY SOMETIMES MEANT THAT THE INTERNAL SYSTEMIC INEQUALITIES THAT FUELED POVERTY WERE LEFT UNADDRESSED. FURTHERMORE, THE SUSPICION DIRECTED AT MARGINALIZED COMMUNITIES COULD REINFORCE EXISTING PREJUDICES AND CREATE FURTHER BARRIERS TO SOCIAL MOBILITY. THE OPPORTUNITY TO FOSTER NATIONAL UNITY AND ADDRESS ROOT CAUSES OF INEQUALITY WAS MISSED, LEADING TO A CONTINUATION OF THE VERY DIVIDES THAT THE WAR ON POVERTY SOUGHT TO BRIDGE, ALBEIT WITH A FLAWED UNDERSTANDING OF THE OBSTACLES.

LESSONS LEARNED FOR CONTEMPORARY POLICY

THE STUDY OF COLD WAR INTELLIGENCE FAILURES IN THE WAR ON POVERTY OFFERS PROFOUND AND ENDURING LESSONS FOR CONTEMPORARY POLICY. IT UNDERSCORES THE CRITICAL IMPORTANCE OF ACCURATE, UNBIASED INTELLIGENCE IN FORMULATING EFFECTIVE DOMESTIC STRATEGIES. THE TENDENCY TO VIEW SOCIAL ISSUES THROUGH A GEOPOLITICAL LENS, WHILE PERHAPS UNDERSTANDABLE IN A TIME OF INTENSE GLOBAL RIVALRY, PROVED DETRIMENTAL TO ADDRESSING FUNDAMENTAL HUMAN NEEDS. TODAY, POLICYMAKERS MUST REMAIN VIGILANT AGAINST ALLOWING IDEOLOGICAL BIASES OR NATIONAL SECURITY ANXIETIES TO OVERSHADOW THE NUANCED REALITIES OF POVERTY AND INEQUALITY.

FURTHERMORE, THESE HISTORICAL FAILURES HIGHLIGHT THE NECESSITY OF FOSTERING GENUINE PARTNERSHIPS WITH AFFECTED COMMUNITIES. INTELLIGENCE GATHERING SHOULD PRIORITIZE UNDERSTANDING THE LIVED EXPERIENCES AND AUTHENTIC NEEDS OF THOSE FACING HARDSHIP, RATHER THAN FOCUSING SOLELY ON IDENTIFYING POTENTIAL THREATS. INVESTING IN COMMUNITY-BASED RESEARCH AND EMPOWERING LOCAL VOICES CAN PROVIDE MORE ACTIONABLE AND EFFECTIVE INSIGHTS THAN RELYING ON TOP-DOWN ANALYSES THAT MAY BE DETACHED FROM REALITY. THE LESSONS FROM THIS ERA SERVE AS A STARK REMINDER THAT TRULY IMPACTFUL SOCIAL POLICY REQUIRES EMPATHY, ACCURATE INFORMATION, AND A COMMITMENT TO UNDERSTANDING THE COMPLEXITIES OF HUMAN STRUGGLE FROM THE GROUND UP.

Q: HOW DID THE COLD WAR CLIMATE INFLUENCE INTELLIGENCE AGENCIES' PERCEPTION OF POVERTY IN THE US?

A: THE COLD WAR CLIMATE INSTILLED A DEEP-SEATED SUSPICION WITHIN INTELLIGENCE AGENCIES, LEADING THEM TO OFTEN VIEW SOCIAL UNREST AND ECONOMIC DISPARITIES IN THE US AS POTENTIAL MANIFESTATIONS OF SOVIET OR COMMUNIST INFLUENCE, RATHER THAN AS LEGITIMATE GRIEVANCES STEMMING FROM SYSTEMIC ISSUES.

Q: WERE SPECIFIC ANTI-POVERTY PROGRAMS DIRECTLY SABOTAGED BY INTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS DURING THE COLD WAR?

A: WHILE DIRECT SABOTAGE IS DIFFICULT TO PROVE, INTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS UNDOUBTEDLY INFLUENCED PROGRAM DESIGN AND IMPLEMENTATION BY CREATING AN ATMOSPHERE OF SUSPICION AROUND ACTIVISTS AND FRAMING POVERTY AS A SECURITY ISSUE. THIS LED TO RESOURCE MISALLOCATION AND A FOCUS ON CONTROL RATHER THAN EMPOWERMENT, INDIRECTLY HINDERING PROGRAM EFFECTIVENESS.

Q: WHAT ROLE DID THE FBI PLAY IN THE INTELLIGENCE FAILURES RELATED TO THE WAR ON POVERTY?

A: THE FBI, UNDER J. EDGAR HOOVER, WAS HIGHLY ACTIVE IN SURVEILLING AND CATALOGING DOMESTIC DISSENT, INCLUDING ACTIVISTS INVOLVED IN ANTI-POVERTY AND CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENTS. THIS EXTENSIVE SURVEILLANCE, OFTEN BASED ON UNSUBSTANTIATED SUSPICIONS OF COMMUNIST TIES, CREATED A CHILLING EFFECT AND DISTORTED THE UNDERSTANDING OF THE GENUINE NEEDS OF IMPOVERISHED COMMUNITIES.

Q: HOW DID THE FOCUS ON EXTERNAL THREATS DIVERT ATTENTION FROM INTERNAL ECONOMIC ISSUES?

A: THE PRIMARY FOCUS OF ECONOMIC INTELLIGENCE DURING THE COLD WAR WAS ON ASSESSING THE ECONOMIC CAPABILITIES AND THREATS POSED BY THE SOVIET UNION. THIS OFTEN MEANT THAT DETAILED ANALYSIS OF INTERNAL ECONOMIC WEAKNESSES, SUCH AS REGIONAL DEINDUSTRIALIZATION OR DISCRIMINATORY ECONOMIC PRACTICES THAT CONTRIBUTED TO POVERTY, RECEIVED LESS ATTENTION.

Q: WHAT ARE THE LASTING IMPACTS OF THESE INTELLIGENCE FAILURES ON TRUST BETWEEN COMMUNITIES AND GOVERNMENT?

A: THE INTELLIGENCE FAILURES LED TO SIGNIFICANT EROSION OF TRUST. COMMUNITIES, PARTICULARLY MINORITY AND LOW-INCOME GROUPS, FELT UNFAIRLY TARGETED AND SURVEILLED, CREATING A LEGACY OF SKEPTICISM TOWARDS GOVERNMENT INSTITUTIONS AND INITIATIVES AIMED AT ADDRESSING THEIR NEEDS.

Q: COULD MORE EFFECTIVE POVERTY ALLEVIATION HAVE BEEN ACHIEVED IF INTELLIGENCE HAD BEEN MORE ACCURATE?

A: YES, IT IS WIDELY BELIEVED THAT MORE ACCURATE AND COMMUNITY-FOCUSED INTELLIGENCE WOULD HAVE LED TO BETTER-DESIGNED PROGRAMS, MORE EFFECTIVE RESOURCE ALLOCATION, AND A GREATER UNDERSTANDING OF THE ROOT CAUSES OF POVERTY, THUS POTENTIALLY ACHIEVING MORE SIGNIFICANT ALLEVIATION.

Q: DID INTELLIGENCE AGENCIES EVER TRY TO UNDERSTAND THE TRUE NEEDS OF THE IMPOVERISHED?

A: WHILE SOME ANALYSTS MAY HAVE SOUGHT GENUINE UNDERSTANDING, THE OVERARCHING COLD WAR DIRECTIVE TO IDENTIFY THREATS OFTEN OVERSHADOWED EFFORTS TO CONDUCT NEUTRAL SOCIAL SCIENCE RESEARCH INTO THE CAUSES AND SOLUTIONS FOR POVERTY. THE FRAMEWORK PRIORITIZED SECURITY CONCERNS.

Q: HOW DO THESE HISTORICAL FAILURES INFORM CURRENT APPROACHES TO SOCIAL POLICY AND INTELLIGENCE?

A: THESE FAILURES HIGHLIGHT THE NEED FOR STRICT OVERSIGHT OF INTELLIGENCE AGENCIES, A CLEAR DISTINCTION BETWEEN NATIONAL SECURITY CONCERNS AND LEGITIMATE SOCIAL ACTIVISM, AND A COMMITMENT TO USING INTELLIGENCE TO GENUINELY
