RECOGNIZING THE PREVALENCE AND PURPOSE OF THESE COMMON MEDICAL ACRONYMS IS THE FIRST STEP TOWARDS IMPROVING HEALTH LITERACY.

THIS EFFICIENCY IS VITAL IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS WHERE RAPID ASSESSMENT AND DOCUMENTATION ARE CRITICAL. FURTHERMORE, MANY RESEARCH PAPERS AND CLINICAL GUIDELINES RELY HEAVILY ON ESTABLISHED ACRONYMS TO PRESENT COMPLEX FINDINGS IN A DIGESTIBLE FORMAT.

VITAL SIGNS ACRONYMS EXPLAINED

- **BP:** BLOOD PRESSURE. THIS IS THE PRESSURE OF CIRCULATING BLOOD ON THE WALLS OF BLOOD VESSELS. IT'S TYPICALLY MEASURED IN MILLIMETERS OF MERCURY (MMHG) AND EXPRESSED AS TWO NUMBERS: SYSTOLIC OVER DIASTOLIC (E.G., 120/80 MMHG).
- **HR:** HEART RATE. THIS REFERS TO THE NUMBER OF TIMES THE HEART BEATS PER MINUTE (BPM).
- **RR:** RESPIRATORY RATE. THIS INDICATES THE NUMBER OF BREATHS A PERSON TAKES PER MINUTE.
- **TEMP:** TEMPERATURE. THIS IS THE MEASUREMENT OF THE BODY'S INTERNAL HEAT, USUALLY IN DEGREES FAHRENHEIT (°F) OR CELSIUS (°C).
- **O2 SAT:** OXYGEN SATURATION. THIS IS THE FRACTION OF OXYGEN-SATURATED HEMOGLOBIN TO TOTAL HEMOGLOBIN IN THE BLOOD, TYPICALLY MEASURED USING A PULSE OXIMETER AND EXPRESSED AS A PERCENTAGE (%).
- **SpO2:** PERIPHERAL OXYGEN SATURATION. SIMILAR TO O2 SAT, THIS SPECIFICALLY REFERS TO THE OXYGEN SATURATION MEASURED IN THE PERIPHERY, USUALLY A FINGER OR EARLOBE.

MEASUREMENTS AND OTHER KEY INDICATORS

BEYOND THE PRIMARY VITAL SIGNS, OTHER MEASUREMENTS AND PATIENT INDICATORS ARE FREQUENTLY ABBREVIATED. THESE PROVIDE FURTHER INSIGHT INTO A PATIENT'S PHYSIOLOGICAL STATE AND ARE COMMONLY ENCOUNTERED IN MEDICAL RECORDS.

- **BMI:** BODY MASS INDEX. A MEASURE OF BODY FAT BASED ON HEIGHT AND WEIGHT, USED TO CATEGORIZE INDIVIDUALS AS UNDERWEIGHT, HEALTHY WEIGHT, OVERWEIGHT, OR OBESE.
- **WBC:** WHITE BLOOD CELL COUNT. AN INDICATOR OF INFECTION OR INFLAMMATION.
- **RBC:** RED BLOOD CELL COUNT. REFLECTS THE NUMBER OF RED BLOOD CELLS, CRUCIAL FOR OXYGEN TRANSPORT.
- **Hgb:** HEMOGLOBIN. THE PROTEIN IN RED BLOOD CELLS RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OXYGEN.
- **Hct:** HEMATOCRIT. THE PROPORTION OF RED BLOOD CELLS TO THE TOTAL VOLUME OF BLOOD.

ESSENTIAL ACRONYMS IN DIAGNOSTIC IMAGING AND TESTS

DIAGNOSTIC TESTS AND IMAGING ARE CORNERSTONES OF MODERN MEDICINE, PROVIDING CRUCIAL INFORMATION FOR DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT PLANNING. - **MRI:** MAGNETIC RESONANCE IMAGING. A MEDICAL IMAGING TECHNIQUE USED IN RADIOLOGY TO FORM PICTURES OF THE ANATOMY AND PHYSIOLOGICAL PROCESSES OF THE BODY. IT USES STRONG MAGNETIC FIELDS AND RADIO WAVES.
- **ULTRASOUND (OR US):** A MEDICAL IMAGING TECHNIQUE THAT USES HIGH-FREQUENCY SOUND WAVES TO CREATE IMAGES OF INTERNAL BODY STRUCTURES.
- **PET SCAN:** POSITRON EMISSION TOMOGRAPHY SCAN. A NUCLEAR MEDICINE IMAGING TECHNIQUE THAT PRODUCES A THREE-DIMENSIONAL IMAGE SHOWING METABOLIC ACTIVITY OF ORGANS AND TISSUES.

LABORATORY TESTS AND RESULTS

BLOOD TESTS, URINE TESTS, AND OTHER LABORATORY ANALYSES PROVIDE A WEALTH OF INFORMATION ABOUT A PATIENT'S HEALTH. HERE ARE SOME COMMONLY ENCOUNTERED ACRONYMS IN LAB REPORTS.

- **CBC:** COMPLETE BLOOD COUNT. A BLOOD TEST USED TO EVALUATE OVERALL HEALTH AND DETECT A WIDE RANGE OF DISORDERS, INCLUDING ANEMIA, INFECTION, AND LEUKEMIA.
- **BMP:** BASIC METABOLIC PANEL. A COMMON BLOOD TEST THAT MEASURES LEVELS OF ELECTROLYTES, GLUCOSE, AND WASTE PRODUCTS LIKE CREATININE AND BLOOD UREA NITROGEN (BUN).
- **CMP:** COMPREHENSIVE METABOLIC PANEL. AN EXPANDED VERSION OF THE BMP THAT INCLUDES LIVER FUNCTION TESTS AND PROTEIN LEVELS.
- **LFTs:** LIVER FUNCTION TESTS. A GROUP OF BLOOD TESTS THAT PROVIDE INFORMATION ABOUT THE STATE OF THE LIVER.
- **ECG/EKG:** ELECTROCARDIOGRAM. A TEST THAT RECORDS THE ELECTRICAL ACTIVITY OF THE HEART.
- **EEG:** ELECTROENCEPHALOGRAM. A TEST THAT RECORDS THE ELECTRICAL ACTIVITY OF THE BRAIN.
- **UA:** URINALYSIS. A PHYSICAL AND CHEMICAL EXAMINATION OF URINE TO DETECT AND MANAGE A WIDE RANGE OF DISORDERS, SUCH AS URINARY TRACT INFECTIONS, KIDNEY DISEASE, AND DIABETES.

KEY ACRONYMS RELATED TO PATIENT CARE AND CONDITIONS

THE DAILY MANAGEMENT OF PATIENT CARE INVOLVES A CONSTANT STREAM OF COMMUNICATION ABOUT DIAGNOSES, SYMPTOMS, AND TREATMENT PLANS. - **DM:** DIABETES MELLITUS. A CHRONIC CONDITION THAT AFFECTS HOW YOUR BODY TURNS FOOD INTO ENERGY.
- **HTN:** HYPERTENSION. HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE.
- **MI:** MYOCARDIAL INFARCTION. COMMONLY KNOWN AS A HEART ATTACK.
- **PE:** PULMONARY EMBOLISM. A BLOCKAGE IN ONE OF THE PULMONARY ARTERIES IN YOUR LUNGS.
- **PVD:** PERIPHERAL VASCULAR DISEASE. NARROWING OF THE VESSELS THAT CARRY BLOOD TO AND FROM THE LIMBS.
- **TIA:** TRANSIENT ISCHEMIC ATTACK. OFTEN CALLED A MINI-STROKE, IT'S A TEMPORARY BLOCK OF BLOOD FLOW TO THE BRAIN.

PATIENT STATUS AND CARE DIRECTIVES

ACRONYMS ARE ALSO USED TO DESCRIBE A PATIENT'S CONDITION, THEIR TREATMENT GOALS, AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR CARE.

- **DOB:** DATE OF BIRTH. ESSENTIAL FOR PATIENT IDENTIFICATION.
- **MRN:** MEDICAL RECORD NUMBER. A UNIQUE IDENTIFIER FOR A PATIENT'S MEDICAL CHART.
- **RN:** REGISTERED NURSE. A LICENSED NURSE WHO PROVIDES DIRECT PATIENT CARE.
- **LPN:** LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE. A NURSE WHO PROVIDES BASIC NURSING CARE.
- **MD:** MEDICAL DOCTOR. A PHYSICIAN.
- **DO:** DOCTOR OF OSTEOPATHIC MEDICINE. A PHYSICIAN WITH A SPECIFIC APPROACH TO PATIENT CARE.
- **HMO:** HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION. A TYPE OF MANAGED CARE ORGANIZATION THAT PROVIDES HEALTHCARE SERVICES.
- **PPO:** PREFERRED PROVIDER ORGANIZATION. ANOTHER TYPE OF MANAGED CARE ORGANIZATION OFFERING MORE

FLEXIBILITY IN PROVIDER CHOICE.

- **SNF:** SKILLED NURSING FACILITY. A FACILITY THAT PROVIDES REHABILITATION AND MEDICAL CARE.
- **PT:** PHYSICAL THERAPY. THERAPY TO IMPROVE MOVEMENT AND FUNCTION.
- **OT:** OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY. THERAPY TO HELP PATIENTS PERFORM DAILY ACTIVITIES.
- **ST:** SPEECH THERAPY. THERAPY TO IMPROVE COMMUNICATION AND SWALLOWING.

IMPORTANT ACRONYMS IN PHARMACOLOGY AND TREATMENT

MEDICATION MANAGEMENT AND TREATMENT PROTOCOLS ARE HEAVILY RELIANT ON PRECISE TERMINOLOGY, INCLUDING A WIDE ARRAY OF ACRONYMS. UNDERSTANDING THESE COMMON MEDICAL ACRONYMS AND THEIR MEANINGS IS VITAL FOR SAFE AND EFFECTIVE TREATMENT ADHERENCE.

MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION AND DOSAGES

- **PRN:** PRO RE NATA (AS NEEDED). MEDICATION TO BE TAKEN ONLY WHEN NECESSARY.
- **BID (OR BD):** BIS IN DIE (TWICE A DAY). MEDICATION TAKEN TWO TIMES DAILY.
- **TID:** TER IN DIE (THREE TIMES A DAY). MEDICATION TAKEN THREE TIMES DAILY.
- **QID:** QUATER IN DIE (FOUR TIMES A DAY). MEDICATION TAKEN FOUR TIMES DAILY.
- **QHS:** QUAEQUAQUE HORA SOMNI (EVERY BEDTIME). MEDICATION TO BE TAKEN AT BEDTIME.
- **QAM:** EVERY MORNING. MEDICATION TO BE TAKEN EACH MORNING.
- **QPM:** EVERY EVENING. MEDICATION TO BE TAKEN EACH EVENING.
- **STAT:** STATIM (IMMEDIATELY). MEDICATION TO BE ADMINISTERED WITHOUT DELAY.

TREATMENT PLANS AND MODALITIES

BEYOND MEDICATION, TREATMENT PLANS ENCOMPASS VARIOUS THERAPIES AND INTERVENTIONS, EACH WITH ITS OWN SET OF COMMON ACRONYMS.

- **RT:** RADIATION THERAPY. TREATMENT USING HIGH-ENERGY RADIATION TO KILL CANCER CELLS.

- **CHEMO:** CHEMOTHERAPY. TREATMENT USING DRUGS TO KILL CANCER CELLS.
- **PTCA:** PERCUTANEOUS TRANSLUMINAL CORONARY ANGIOPLASTY. A PROCEDURE TO OPEN BLOCKED CORONARY ARTERIES.
- **CABG:** CORONARY ARTERY BYPASS GRAFT. A SURGICAL PROCEDURE TO IMPROVE BLOOD FLOW TO THE HEART.
- **ERCP:** ENDOSCOPIC RETROGRADE CHOLANGIOPANCREATOGRAPHY. A PROCEDURE TO DIAGNOSE AND TREAT PROBLEMS OF THE BILE AND PANCREATIC DUCTS.
- **GI:** GASTROINTESTINAL. PERTAINING TO THE STOMACH AND INTESTINES.
- **GU:** GENITOURINARY. PERTAINING TO THE REPRODUCTIVE AND URINARY ORGANS.

FREQUENTLY USED ACRONYMS IN MEDICAL SPECIALTIES

- **MI:** MYOCARDIAL INFARCTION (HEART ATTACK).
- **MVP:** MITRAL VALVE PROLAPSE. A CONDITION IN WHICH THE FLAPS OF THE MITRAL VALVE DON'T CLOSE PROPERLY.
- **RV:** RIGHT VENTRICLE. THE RIGHT LOWER CHAMBER OF THE HEART.
- **LV:** LEFT VENTRICLE. THE LEFT LOWER CHAMBER OF THE HEART.

NEUROLOGY AND NERVOUS SYSTEM ACRONYMS

DISORDERS OF THE BRAIN, SPINAL CORD, AND NERVES HAVE THEIR OWN COMMON ACRONYMS.

- **CVA:** CEREBROVASCULAR ACCIDENT. COMMONLY KNOWN AS A STROKE.
- **MS:** MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS. A CHRONIC DISEASE AFFECTING THE CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM.
- **ALS:** AMYOTROPHIC LATERAL SCLEROSIS. A PROGRESSIVE NEURODEGENERATIVE DISEASE THAT AFFECTS NERVE CELLS IN THE BRAIN AND SPINAL CORD.

- **GCS:** GLASGOW COMA SCALE. A SCALE USED TO ASSESS A PERSON'S LEVEL OF CONSCIOUSNESS.
- **EEG:** ELECTROENCEPHALOGRAM. RECORDS ELECTRICAL ACTIVITY OF THE BRAIN.

ONCOLOGY AND CANCER-RELATED ACRONYMS

THE FIELD OF CANCER TREATMENT USES A VAST NUMBER OF ACRONYMS FOR DIAGNOSES, TREATMENTS, AND STAGING.

- **CA:** CANCER.
- **NHL:** NON-HODGKIN LYMPHOMA. A TYPE OF CANCER THAT BEGINS IN LYMPHOCYTES.
- **ALL:** ACUTE LYMPHOBLASTIC LEUKEMIA. A TYPE OF CANCER THAT AFFECTS WHITE BLOOD CELLS.
- **AML:** ACUTE MYELOID LEUKEMIA. A CANCER OF THE BLOOD AND BONE MARROW.
- **Dx:** DIAGNOSIS.
- **Tx:** TREATMENT.
- **Rx:** PRESCRIPTION OR TREATMENT.
- **METS:** METASTASES. THE SPREAD OF CANCER FROM THE PRIMARY SITE TO OTHER PARTS OF THE BODY.
