

COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS

UNDERSTANDING THE CORE OF "PROLETARIANS AND COMMUNISTS"

CHAPTER 2 OF THE COMMUNIST MANIFESTO, "PROLETARIANS AND COMMUNISTS," SERVES AS A PIVOTAL ARTICULATION OF THE COMMUNIST PROGRAM AND ITS PERCEIVED ROLE WITHIN THE BURGEONING WORKING-CLASS MOVEMENT OF THE MID-19TH CENTURY. THIS SECTION DIRECTLY ADDRESSES THE FUNDAMENTAL QUESTION: WHAT IS THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE ORGANIZED COMMUNIST PARTY AND THE VAST MASS OF THE PROLETARIAT, THE INDUSTRIAL WORKING CLASS? MARX AND ENGELS METICULOUSLY LAY OUT THE SHARED OBJECTIVES AND THE UNIQUE POSITION OF COMMUNISTS, AIMING TO DISPEL MISCONCEPTIONS AND GALVANIZE REVOLUTIONARY ACTION. A DETAILED COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS REVEALS THE STRATEGIC THINKING BEHIND THIS CALL TO ARMS.

THE CHAPTER BEGINS BY DISTINGUISHING COMMUNISTS FROM OTHER WORKING-CLASS PARTIES. WHILE ALL WORKERS ARE UNITED BY THEIR EXPLOITATION UNDER CAPITALISM, COMMUNISTS POSSESS A DEEPER, MORE THEORETICAL UNDERSTANDING OF THE HISTORICAL TRAJECTORY AND THE ULTIMATE GOALS OF THE PROLETARIAN STRUGGLE. THEY ARE NOT SIMPLY A FACTION OF THE WORKING CLASS BUT RATHER THE MOST ADVANCED, MOST RESOLUTE SECTION, INTELLECTUALLY EQUIPPED TO GUIDE THE MOVEMENT TOWARDS ITS INEVITABLE TRIUMPH. THIS SELF-PERCEPTION AS THE VANGUARD IS A RECURRING THEME THAT NECESSITATES CAREFUL EXAMINATION.

THE VANGUARD ROLE OF COMMUNISTS

MARX AND ENGELS EMPHATICALLY STATE THAT COMMUNISTS DO NOT FORM A SEPARATE PARTY OPPOSED TO OTHER WORKING-CLASS PARTIES. INSTEAD, THEY ARE PRESENTED AS THE SECTION OF THE WORKING CLASS THAT BEST UNDERSTANDS THE CONDITIONS, THE LINE OF MARCH, AND THE GENERAL RESULTS OF THE PROLETARIAN MOVEMENT. THIS IMPLIES THAT COMMUNISTS POSSESS A UNIQUE INSIGHT INTO THE HISTORICAL FORCES AT PLAY, A THEORETICAL CLARITY THAT ALLOWS THEM TO TRANSCEND THE IMMEDIATE STRUGGLES OF INDIVIDUAL WORKERS AND GRASP THE OVERARCHING OBJECTIVES OF THE REVOLUTION. THIS UNDERSTANDING OF COMMUNISM AS AN INTELLECTUAL AND STRATEGIC VANGUARD IS CENTRAL TO THEIR ARGUMENT.

THEY EMPHASIZE THAT COMMUNISTS HAVE OVER THE PROLETARIAT THE ADVANTAGE OF UNDERSTANDING THE LINE OF MARCH, THE CONDITIONS, AND, CONSEQUENTLY, THE ULTIMATE GENERAL RESULTS OF THE PROLETARIAN MOVEMENT. THIS INTELLECTUAL LEADERSHIP IS NOT PRESENTED AS A CLAIM TO AUTHORITARIAN CONTROL BUT AS A NECESSARY GUIDING FORCE TO NAVIGATE THE COMPLEXITIES OF CLASS STRUGGLE AND ACHIEVE THE ABOLITION OF CLASS DISTINCTIONS. THE COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS HIGHLIGHTS THIS ASPECT AS A KEY DIFFERENTIATOR OF THE COMMUNIST MOVEMENT.

COMMUNISTS' RELATIONSHIP WITH THE BROADER PROLETARIAT

THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN COMMUNISTS AND THE REST OF THE PROLETARIAT IS PORTRAYED AS ONE OF SOLIDARITY AND ENLIGHTENMENT. COMMUNISTS DO NOT SEEK TO ESTABLISH A SEPARATE INTEREST, DISTINCT FROM THAT OF THE WORKING CLASS AS A WHOLE. THEIR IMMEDIATE AIMS ARE THE FORMATION OF THE PROLETARIAT INTO A CLASS, THE OVERTHROW OF THE BOURGEOIS SUPREMACY, AND THE CONQUEST OF POLITICAL POWER BY THE PROLETARIAT. THESE ARE UNIVERSAL GOALS SHARED BY ALL CONSCIOUS MEMBERS OF THE WORKING CLASS.

HOWEVER, COMMUNISTS DISTINGUISH THEMSELVES BY THEIR ABILITY TO ARTICULATE AND PURSUE THESE GOALS WITH GREATER CLARITY AND DETERMINATION. THEY REPRESENT THE MOVEMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY, POSSESSING A COMPREHENSIVE VISION THAT ENCOMPASSES THE LONG-TERM TRANSFORMATION OF SOCIETY. THIS NUANCED PORTRAYAL SUGGESTS THAT COMMUNISTS ARE NOT MERELY AGITATORS BUT ALSO EDUCATORS, WORKING TO RAISE THE CONSCIOUSNESS OF THE BROADER WORKING CLASS TO THE LEVEL OF THEIR OWN UNDERSTANDING. THE COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS UNDERSCORES THIS EDUCATIONAL AND GUIDING FUNCTION.

CRITIQUE OF BOURGEOIS SOCIETY AND EXPLOITATION

CHAPTER 2 BUILDS DIRECTLY ON THE FOUNDATIONAL CRITIQUE OF CAPITALISM PRESENTED IN CHAPTER 1, "BOURGEOIS AND PROLETARIANS." THE EXPLOITATION INHERENT IN THE BOURGEOIS SYSTEM IS THE BEDROCK UPON WHICH THE COMMUNIST PROJECT IS BUILT. MARX AND ENGELS REITERATE THAT UNDER CAPITALISM, THE BOURGEOISIE, OR THE CAPITALIST CLASS, OWNS THE MEANS OF PRODUCTION AND EXPLOITS THE LABOR OF THE PROLETARIAT, THE WORKING CLASS, WHO OWN NOTHING BUT THEIR LABOR POWER. THIS FUNDAMENTAL IMBALANCE IS THE SOURCE OF CLASS CONFLICT.

THE CAPITALIST MODE OF PRODUCTION, ACCORDING TO THE MANIFESTO, GENERATES WEALTH FOR THE FEW BY SYSTEMATICALLY EXTRACTING SURPLUS VALUE FROM THE LABOR OF THE MANY. THIS SURPLUS VALUE, THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE VALUE PRODUCED BY THE WORKER AND THE WAGE THEY RECEIVE, IS APPROPRIATED BY THE CAPITALIST AS PROFIT. THIS PROCESS IS NOT MERELY AN ECONOMIC TRANSACTION BUT A FUNDAMENTAL SOCIAL RELATIONSHIP CHARACTERIZED BY INHERENT INEQUALITY AND EXPLOITATION. A THOROUGH COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS MUST GRAPPLE WITH THIS CRITIQUE OF EXPLOITATION.

THE CONCEPT OF SURPLUS VALUE

WHILE NOT EXPLICITLY DETAILING THE ECONOMIC THEORY OF SURPLUS VALUE AS FOUND IN LATER WORKS LIKE "DAS KAPITAL," CHAPTER 2 ALLUDES TO THIS CENTRAL CONCEPT. THE BOURGEOISIE, BY OWNING THE MEANS OF PRODUCTION – FACTORIES,

LAND, MACHINERY – ARE ABLE TO COMPEL THE PROLETARIAT TO SELL THEIR LABOR POWER. THE VALUE OF THIS LABOR POWER, IN TERMS OF THE COST OF SUSTAINING THE WORKER, IS LESS THAN THE VALUE THAT THE WORKER CREATES THROUGH THEIR LABOR. THIS DIFFERENCE IS THE SURPLUS VALUE, WHICH FORMS THE BASIS OF CAPITALIST PROFIT AND ACCUMULATION.

THE MANIFESTO ARGUES THAT THIS EXPLOITATION IS NOT A TEMPORARY ABERRATION BUT AN INHERENT FEATURE OF THE CAPITALIST SYSTEM. THE RELENTLESS DRIVE FOR PROFIT COMPELS CAPITALISTS TO CONSTANTLY SEEK WAYS TO INCREASE SURPLUS VALUE, OFTEN BY INTENSIFYING LABOR, REDUCING WAGES, OR INVESTING IN TECHNOLOGY THAT DISPLACES WORKERS. THIS CREATES A PERPETUAL CYCLE OF EXPLOITATION AND ALIENATION FOR THE PROLETARIAT. THE COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS CONSISTENTLY RETURNS TO THIS CENTRAL THEME OF EXPLOITATION.

THE SOCIAL RELATIONS OF PRODUCTION

BEYOND THE PURELY ECONOMIC DIMENSION, MARX AND ENGELS HIGHLIGHT THE SOCIAL RELATIONS THAT UNDERPIN CAPITALIST PRODUCTION. THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN BOURGEOISIE AND PROLETARIAT IS NOT ONE OF EQUALS BUT OF DOMINATOR AND DOMINATED. THE CAPITALIST CLASS HOLDS ECONOMIC AND POLITICAL POWER, WHICH THEY USE TO MAINTAIN AND REPRODUCE THEIR PRIVILEGED POSITION. THIS POWER DYNAMIC EXTENDS TO ALL ASPECTS OF SOCIETY, SHAPING LAWS, CULTURE, AND IDEOLOGY TO FAVOR THE INTERESTS OF THE BOURGEOISIE.

THE MANIFESTO ARGUES THAT CAPITALISM, WHILE A REVOLUTIONARY FORCE THAT HAS TRANSFORMED THE MEANS OF PRODUCTION, HAS ALSO CREATED A SYSTEM OF PROFOUND SOCIAL ANTAGONISM. THE VERY SUCCESS OF CAPITALISM IN EXPANDING PRODUCTIVE FORCES CREATES THE CONDITIONS FOR ITS OWN DOWNFALL, AS IT SIMULTANEOUSLY GENERATES A GROWING, INCREASINGLY ORGANIZED, AND UNIVERSALLY EXPLOITED PROLETARIAT. THIS DIALECTICAL UNDERSTANDING IS A CORNERSTONE OF MARXIST THOUGHT AND IS EVIDENT THROUGHOUT CHAPTER 2. A PROPER COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS WILL ALWAYS CONSIDER THESE SOCIAL RELATIONS.

DEFINING COMMUNISM: ABOLITION OF PRIVATE PROPERTY AND CLASS DISTINCTION

CENTRAL TO THE COMMUNIST PROGRAM, AS ARTICULATED IN CHAPTER 2, IS THE ABOLITION OF PRIVATE PROPERTY, SPECIFICALLY BOURGEOIS PRIVATE PROPERTY, WHICH IS UNDERSTOOD AS PROPERTY BASED ON THE EXPLOITATION OF THE LABOR OF OTHERS. MARX AND ENGELS ARE CAREFUL TO DISTINGUISH THIS FROM PERSONAL PROPERTY, SUCH AS ONE'S TOOLS, CLOTHING, OR DOMICILE. THEIR TARGET IS THE PRIVATE OWNERSHIP OF THE MEANS OF PRODUCTION THAT ENABLES ONE CLASS TO LIVE OFF THE LABOR OF ANOTHER.

THE ULTIMATE GOAL OF COMMUNISM IS THE ABOLITION OF ALL CLASS DISTINCTIONS, AND WITH THEM, THE ABOLITION OF THE STATE, WHICH THEY SEE AS AN INSTRUMENT OF CLASS OPPRESSION. COMMUNISM AIMS TO CREATE A CLASSLESS SOCIETY WHERE THE MEANS OF PRODUCTION ARE OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY THE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE, LEADING TO A MORE EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION OF WEALTH AND RESOURCES. THIS IS THE TRANSFORMATIVE PROMISE THAT DRIVES THE COMMUNIST MOVEMENT. THE COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS INVARIABLY FOCUSES ON THIS ABOLITION.

ABOLITION OF BOURGEOIS PRIVATE PROPERTY

THE MOST CONTROVERSIAL AND DEFINING PLANK OF THE COMMUNIST PROGRAM IN CHAPTER 2 IS THE CALL FOR THE ABOLITION OF BOURGEOIS PRIVATE PROPERTY. MARX AND ENGELS ARGUE THAT THIS FORM OF PROPERTY IS NOT THE PRODUCT OF INDIVIDUAL LABOR BUT THE RESULT OF THE COLLECTIVE LABOR OF THE PROLETARIAT, EXPROPRIATED BY THE BOURGEOISIE. THEREFORE, ITS ABOLITION IS NOT THE EXPROPRIATION OF THE WORKING MAN OF THE FRUITS OF HIS LABOR, BUT THE EXPROPRIATION OF THE EXPROPRIATORS.

THEY COUNTER COMMON OBJECTIONS BY STATING THAT COMMUNISM DOES NOT DEPRIVE ANY MAN OF THE POWER TO

APPROPRIATE THE PRODUCTS OF SOCIETY; ALL THAT IT DOES IS TO DEPRIVE EACH MAN OF THE POWER TO SUBJUGATE THE LABOR OF OTHERS BY MEANS OF SUCH APPROPRIATIONS. THE GOAL IS TO TRANSFORM PROPERTY RELATIONS FROM THOSE OF DOMINATION AND EXPLOITATION TO THOSE OF COLLECTIVE OWNERSHIP AND COMMON BENEFIT. THIS IS A FUNDAMENTAL REORDERING OF SOCIETY, AS EXPLAINED IN ANY SERIOUS COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS.

ELIMINATION OF CLASS ANTAGONISMS

THE ABOLITION OF PRIVATE PROPERTY IS SEEN AS THE PREREQUISITE FOR THE ELIMINATION OF CLASS ANTAGONISMS. AS LONG AS THERE ARE CLASSES, THERE WILL BE INHERENT CONFLICT, AS EACH CLASS STRIVES TO MAINTAIN OR ADVANCE ITS OWN INTERESTS. COMMUNISM AIMS TO DISSOLVE THESE CLASS DIVISIONS BY REMOVING THE ECONOMIC BASIS FOR THEIR EXISTENCE. IN A COMMUNIST SOCIETY, THERE WOULD BE NO BOURGEOISIE TO EXPLOIT AND NO PROLETARIAT TO BE EXPLOITED.

THIS WOULD, IN TURN, LEAD TO THE WITHERING AWAY OF THE STATE, WHICH MARX AND ENGELS VIEWED AS AN APPARATUS OF CLASS RULE. IN A CLASSLESS SOCIETY, THE NEED FOR A COERCIVE STATE APPARATUS WOULD THEORETICALLY DISAPPEAR, REPLACED BY A SYSTEM OF VOLUNTARY ASSOCIATION AND COMMUNAL SELF-GOVERNANCE. THE ULTIMATE VISION IS A SOCIETY FREE FROM EXPLOITATION, OPPRESSION, AND ALIENATION, A RADICAL DEPARTURE FROM THE EXISTING SOCIAL ORDER. THIS ASPIRATION IS A KEY TAKEAWAY FROM ANY COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS.

SPECIFIC MEASURES FOR THE TRANSITION TO COMMUNISM

CHAPTER 2 DOESN'T JUST OUTLINE THE ULTIMATE GOALS OF COMMUNISM; IT ALSO PROPOSES A SERIES OF CONCRETE MEASURES DESIGNED TO FACILITATE THE TRANSITION FROM CAPITALISM TO COMMUNISM. THESE MEASURES ARE PRESENTED AS A PROGRESSIVE AGENDA THAT THE PROLETARIAT, ONCE IN POWER, WOULD IMPLEMENT. THEY ARE INTENDED TO DISMANTLE THE EXISTING BOURGEOIS STATE AND ECONOMY AND LAY THE GROUNDWORK FOR A NEW SOCIAL ORDER.

THESE TRANSITIONAL MEASURES ARE OFTEN THE MOST DEBATED AND CRITIQUED ASPECTS OF THE MANIFESTO. THEY REPRESENT THE PRACTICAL APPLICATION OF COMMUNIST THEORY AND PROVIDE INSIGHT INTO THE IMMEDIATE POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC TRANSFORMATIONS ENVISIONED BY MARX AND ENGELS. UNDERSTANDING THESE PROPOSED STEPS IS CRUCIAL FOR A COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS.

THE TEN POINTS OF THE COMMUNIST PROGRAM

MARX AND ENGELS PRESENT A LIST OF TEN SPECIFIC MEASURES THAT MIGHT BE APPLIED IN THE MOST ADVANCED COUNTRIES. IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT THEY DO NOT PRESENT THESE AS UNIVERSALLY APPLICABLE OR AS A RIGID DOGMA, BUT RATHER AS EXAMPLES OF HOW STATE POWER COULD BE USED TO TRANSITION TOWARDS COMMUNISM. THESE POINTS INCLUDE:

- ABOLITION OF PROPERTY IN LAND AND APPLICATION OF ALL RENTS OF LAND TO PUBLIC PURPOSES.
- A HEAVY PROGRESSIVE OR GRADUATED INCOME TAX.
- ABOLITION OF ALL RIGHT OF INHERITANCE.
- CONFISCATION OF THE PROPERTY OF ALL EMIGRANTS AND REBELS.
- CENTRALISATION OF CREDIT IN THE HANDS OF THE STATE, BY MEANS OF A NATIONAL BANK WITH STATE CAPITAL AND AN EXCLUSIVE MONOPOLY.
- CENTRALISATION OF THE MEANS OF COMMUNICATION AND OF TRANSPORT IN THE HANDS OF THE STATE.

- EXTENSION OF FACTORIES AND INSTRUMENTS OF PRODUCTION OWNED BY THE STATE; THE BRINGING INTO CULTIVATION OF WASTE-LANDS, AND THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE SOIL GENERALLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH A COMMON PLAN.
- EQUAL LIABILITY OF ALL TO WORK. ESTABLISHMENT OF INDUSTRIAL ARMIES, ESPECIALLY FOR AGRICULTURE.
- COMBINATION OF AGRICULTURE WITH MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES, GRADUAL ABOLITION OF THE DISTINCTION BETWEEN TOWN AND COUNTRY, BY A MORE EQUABLE DISTRIBUTION OF THE POPULATION OVER THE COUNTRY.
- FREE EDUCATION FOR ALL CHILDREN IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS. ABOLITION OF CHILDREN'S FACTORY LABOUR IN ITS PRESENT FORM. COMBINATION OF EDUCATION WITH INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION, ETC.

THESE POINTS ILLUSTRATE THE REVOLUTIONARY NATURE OF THE COMMUNIST PROJECT, AIMING TO FUNDAMENTALLY ALTER ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL STRUCTURES. THE COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS OF THESE POINTS REVEALS THE INTENDED SCOPE OF CHANGE.

THE ROLE OF THE STATE IN TRANSITION

THESE TRANSITIONAL MEASURES HIGHLIGHT THE SIGNIFICANT ROLE THAT THE STATE IS ENVISIONED TO PLAY IN THE INITIAL PHASE OF COMMUNISM. THE PROLETARIAT, ONCE IT HAS SEIZED POLITICAL POWER, WOULD USE THE EXISTING STATE APPARATUS – ALBEIT TRANSFORMED – TO IMPLEMENT THESE CHANGES. THIS INCLUDES CENTRALIZING CREDIT, COMMUNICATIONS, AND TRANSPORTATION, AS WELL AS TAKING CONTROL OF KEY INDUSTRIES AND BRINGING UNDEVELOPED LAND INTO CULTIVATION.

THIS EMPHASIS ON STATE POWER IN THE TRANSITION PERIOD HAS BEEN A POINT OF CONTENTION AND DEBATE AMONG MARXISTS AND CRITICS ALIKE. IT SUGGESTS THAT THE ABOLITION OF CLASS SOCIETY IS NOT AN IMMEDIATE, SPONTANEOUS PROCESS BUT ONE THAT REQUIRES CONSCIOUS, ORGANIZED POLITICAL INTERVENTION. THE COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS OFTEN EXPLORES THIS TENSION BETWEEN THE ULTIMATE GOAL OF A STATELESS SOCIETY AND THE USE OF STATE POWER TO ACHIEVE IT.

ADDRESSING COMMON OBJECTIONS TO COMMUNISM

CHAPTER 2 ANTICIPATES AND DIRECTLY ADDRESSES SEVERAL COMMON CRITICISMS AND FEARS ASSOCIATED WITH COMMUNISM, PARTICULARLY THOSE EMANATING FROM THE BOURGEOISIE. BY PREEMPTIVELY REFUTING THESE ARGUMENTS, MARX AND ENGELS AIM TO STRENGTHEN THE APPEAL OF THEIR IDEOLOGY AND COUNTER BOURGEOIS PROPAGANDA. THESE REFUTATIONS ARE INTEGRAL TO UNDERSTANDING THE PERSUASIVE STRATEGY OF THE MANIFESTO.

THE MOST PROMINENT OBJECTION THEY TACKLE IS THE ACCUSATION THAT COMMUNISM SEEKS TO ABOLISH PERSONAL PROPERTY, INDIVIDUALITY, FREEDOM, AND CULTURE. THEY COUNTER THESE CLAIMS BY REDEFINING THESE TERMS WITHIN A COMMUNIST FRAMEWORK AND BY EXPOSING WHAT THEY SEE AS THE HYPOCRITICAL NATURE OF BOURGEOIS CLAIMS TO THESE VALUES. A THOROUGH COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS MUST INCLUDE THIS ENGAGEMENT WITH OBJECTIONS.

THE "ABOLITION OF PERSONALITY, FREEDOM, AND INDIVIDUALITY" CHARGE

THE BOURGEOISIE FREQUENTLY ACCUSED COMMUNISTS OF WANTING TO DESTROY PERSONALITY, FREEDOM, AND INDIVIDUALITY. THEY ARGUE THAT UNDER CAPITALISM, THE VAST MAJORITY OF PEOPLE ARE DENIED TRUE FREEDOM AND INDIVIDUALITY DUE TO THEIR ECONOMIC DEPENDENCE AND ALIENATION.

COMMUNISM, THEY CONTEND, DOES NOT ABOLISH THESE THINGS BUT RATHER LIBERATES THEM FROM THE CONSTRAINTS OF CLASS SOCIETY. BY ENDING EXPLOITATION AND ALIENATION, COMMUNISM AIMS TO CREATE THE CONDITIONS FOR THE FULL DEVELOPMENT OF EVERY INDIVIDUAL'S POTENTIAL. THE FREEDOM THEY ENVISION IS NOT THE FREEDOM OF THE CAPITALIST TO EXPLOIT, BUT THE FREEDOM OF ALL INDIVIDUALS TO REALIZE THEIR FULL HUMAN CAPACITIES. THIS IS A KEY POINT OF CONTENTION IN ANY COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS.

CRITIQUE OF BOURGEOIS FAMILY, EDUCATION, AND NATIONALITY

BEYOND PERSONAL PROPERTY, COMMUNISTS ARE ALSO ACCUSED OF WISHING TO ABOLISH THE FAMILY, EDUCATION, AND NATIONAL DISTINCTIONS. SIMILARLY, THEY SEE BOURGEOIS EDUCATION AS A TOOL FOR PERPETUATING CLASS PRIVILEGE AND PROPOSE FREE, PUBLIC EDUCATION FOR ALL.

REGARDING NATIONALITY, THEY ARGUE THAT THE "COMMON PROPERTY" OF COMMUNISTS AND THE "COMMON ACTION" OF THE PROLETARIANS OF DIFFERENT COUNTRIES ARE ALREADY UNDERMINING NATIONAL DISTINCTIONS. THEY FAMOUSLY CONCLUDE THIS SECTION WITH THE SLOGAN, "WORKING MEN OF ALL COUNTRIES, UNITE!" WHICH ENCAPSULATES THEIR INTERNATIONALIST OUTLOOK AND THEIR BELIEF THAT CLASS SOLIDARITY TRANSCENDS NATIONAL BOUNDARIES. THIS INTERNATIONALIST PERSPECTIVE IS A CRUCIAL ELEMENT OF ANY COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS.

THE INTERNATIONAL NATURE OF THE COMMUNIST STRUGGLE

CHAPTER 2 STRONGLY EMPHASIZES THE INTERNATIONAL CHARACTER OF THE COMMUNIST MOVEMENT. THIS STANDS IN CONTRAST TO THE NATIONALIST SENTIMENTS OFTEN FOSTERED BY THE BOURGEOISIE TO DIVIDE AND CONTROL THE WORKING CLASS. THE INTERNATIONAL NATURE OF COMMUNISM IS A CORE TENET, AS EVIDENT IN ANY COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS.

THE INEVITABLE GLOBAL STRUGGLE

THIS GLOBAL OUTLOOK IS FUNDAMENTAL TO A PROPER COMMUNIST MANIFESTO CHAPTER 2 ANALYSIS.
